Congress authorized the project in 2000. Thune said he realizes the Interior Department is faced with budget cutbacks just like other federal agencies, but he would like to see annual funding restored to the \$20 million or so that was provided in previous years. The three states and 20 communities have paid their complete share of more than \$150 million for the water project, and the federal government has provided about \$200 million so far, or about half its share of the cost.

"Now, the federal government is pulling the rug out from under this project," the Republican senator said. Thune noted that a Senate committee recently proposed an additional \$21 million for rural water projects, and he believes priority for that money should go to projects nearing completion. Rep. Kristi Noem, R-S.D., said earlier Thursday the communities involved in the project need safe, clean water not only for residents but also for businesses thinking of locating in the area. "Adequate and reliable water supplies are certainly critical to job creation and attracting new businesses in rural America. This project would help us get towards that goal," Noem said.
