Currently the ministry is composed of members from several churches in Yankton, but interested individuals don't have to belong to a church to join the cause, Mach said.

"We are a separate nonprofit organization and we're not associ-ated with any church," he said. "We're looking to expand our base of volunteers, and those people just need to have the same interest in feeding some of the poorest in the world and also helping with the hungry around Yankton."

Mach added that other satellites have seen wide variety of volunteers.

You have families doing it in honor of Mom or Dad. You have people doing this at Christmas time instead of giving gifts. You have businesses doing it as a teambuilding exercise and a way to give back to the community," he said. "The opportunities to volunteer are really endless."

Volunteers will work in an assembly line to pack the meals, which consist of a blend of white rice, soy, dehydrated vegetables and vitamins and minerals. The food is then boxed and shipped out to various locations.

Mach said the ministry's first mission will be to send meals to Haiti through the nongovernmental organization Helping Hands for Haiti.

"They use the Kids Against Hunger food in their school systems, and they'll be running out of food in March," he said. "So our goal is to get some food down to them, and we'll be doing that in conjunction with the Kids Against Hunger satellite in Sioux Falls.

Along with helping children worldwide, Kids Against Hunger Yankton will also be distributing meals locally.

"A percentage of what we pack will stay in Yankton and go to the Contact Center and the local back pack program," Mach said.

The ministry also hopes to expand its distribution in the future, he said.

"I think we'd want to look at what we can do in South Dakota on our own Indian reservations. I know there are many ministries there helping the Native Americans, and so we're going to look into if we can help," he said. "Also, we'd like to have a stock of emergency food like this just in case we ever have another Joplin," referring to last spring's devastating tornado outbreak.

Kids Against Hunger Yankton will hold its grand opening with three packing sessions Dec. 3 at Calvary Baptist Church. The ministry is asking interested volunteers to reserve a spot to ensure enough materials are available. Reservations can be made by calling 605-661-0215.

"That's how this story emerged (for Health Affairs)," she stated. "I think sometimes we need to see beyond the science of all the data and hear the stories to bring the

The previous oral health study on Pine Ridge was conducted by the Indian Health Service and was more limited in scope than the University of Colorado study done in 2010. The study team of which Brings Him Back-Janis was a part traveled to 20 communities on the reservation and examined 292 adults and children.

Each participant was given a dental exam. Decay and other problems were identified, and recommendations

The study showed significantly higher numbers of decayed teeth and lower numbers of treated or filled teeth than was found in the 1999 survey.

• 84 percent of children and 97 percent of adults examined had ongoing decay, a problem that can lead to loss of

• Of the participants, 92 adults, or 68 percent, had evidence of gum disease, and 16 percent showed signs of an advanced problem. Gum disease can lead to a loss of teeth and can put people at risk for other serious health prob-

• One child and five adults were found to have signs of a pre-cancerous condition of the mouth. If left untreated, such a condition can progress to full-fledged cancer;

• The high prevalence of decay and gum disease suggests that many participants had chronic pain that could interfere with daily activities; and

 About half the adults in the study had missing teeth and two had no teeth at all.

"Many of the Pine Ridge residents suffer daily from wrenching dental pain, yet they face huge barriers to getting routine care," said lead author Terry Batliner, DDS, of the Colorado School of Public Health and a member of the Cherokee Nation of Oklahoma in a press release. "A severe shortage of dentists willing to practice in isolated areas has left many Americans, including American Indians, with ongoing dental problems that threaten their overall health.

Brings Him Back-Janis believes the key to improved care is better access to oral health services. "In South Dakota, you probably hear that the tribes

have hospitals and clinics, but that doesn't mean you have

access to care," she said.

According to the W.K. Kellogg Foundation, there are 10 dentists working in three locations on Pine Ridge. They provide care for 30,000 people living in an area roughly the size of Connecticut. Many patients have difficulties traveling to these locations or have to wait for months for an appointment.

In her essay, Brings Him Back-Janis recalled meeting a single father with girls aged 4 and 5.

The father had had many teeth extracted and vowed that, unlike him, his daughters would grow up with healthy teeth," she wrote. "But, he tells us, he could not get dental care for his daughters, and now they have serious dental problems, too.

'First he tried — repeatedly and unsuccessfully — to get services from the nearest Indian Health Service dental clinic. He then heard about a South Dakota state program, found out where to apply, went through the application process, and eventually got his daughters accepted into it. All of this took considerable time and effort, and many months passed.

"Finally, he secured an appointment and undertook the lengthy trip to Rapid City. There he was told it was too late to save the front teeth of either girl. The dentist had to pull them all. With their front teeth pulled prematurely, both voung girls feel self-conscious about smiling, eruption patterns for their permanent teeth are affected, and there is risk of malocclusion (incorrect alignment).<sup>3</sup>

One way to address the situation on reservations and in other under-served areas around the country is to embed mid-level providers into the dental health care system, whether they are dental health aide therapists or advanced dental hygiene practitioners. Such an approach has already found success in places like Alaska and Minnesota.

Rather than competing with dental practices, Brings Him Back-Janis said these mid-level providers could feed into them.

"We need to (have these mid-level providers), or we're going to continue to have these high rates of disease and infection among indigenous populations," Brings Him Back-Janis said. "The end result sometimes is death. If anything, we need to re-shape policy and bring about some meaningful action that creates health equity."

Her belief is echoed by Sterling K. Speirn, president and CEO of the W.K. Kellogg Foundation.

"All Americans, including those living in Pine Ridge, should have access to affordable dental care," he stated in a press release. "It is time to expand the reach of dentists by employing a new type of dental practitioner to provide routine care. This approach has worked extremely well in Alaska, where dental therapists are effectively delivering dental care to people living in isolated villages. In fact, since the program got under way in 2005, dental therapists have been able to reach 35,000 people who didn't have access to care before.'

After working for the Indian Health Service for 24 years as a dental assistant and hygienist, Brings Him Back-Janis earned a master's degree in public health and is working toward a doctorate in higher education. She has been an assistant professor at Northern Arizona University since 2004, where she encourages Native American students to study dental hygiene and consider their career choices post-graduation.

"I'm a tribal member. I've lived it and seen it," said Brings Him Back-Janis of her involvement with oral health among Native American tribes. "I'm not going in as an outsider. I'm going as an insider and looking deeper within. It's critical that we hear the voices of the voiceless.'
