Graduation credit is not being offered by Yankton High School for students who choose to participate.

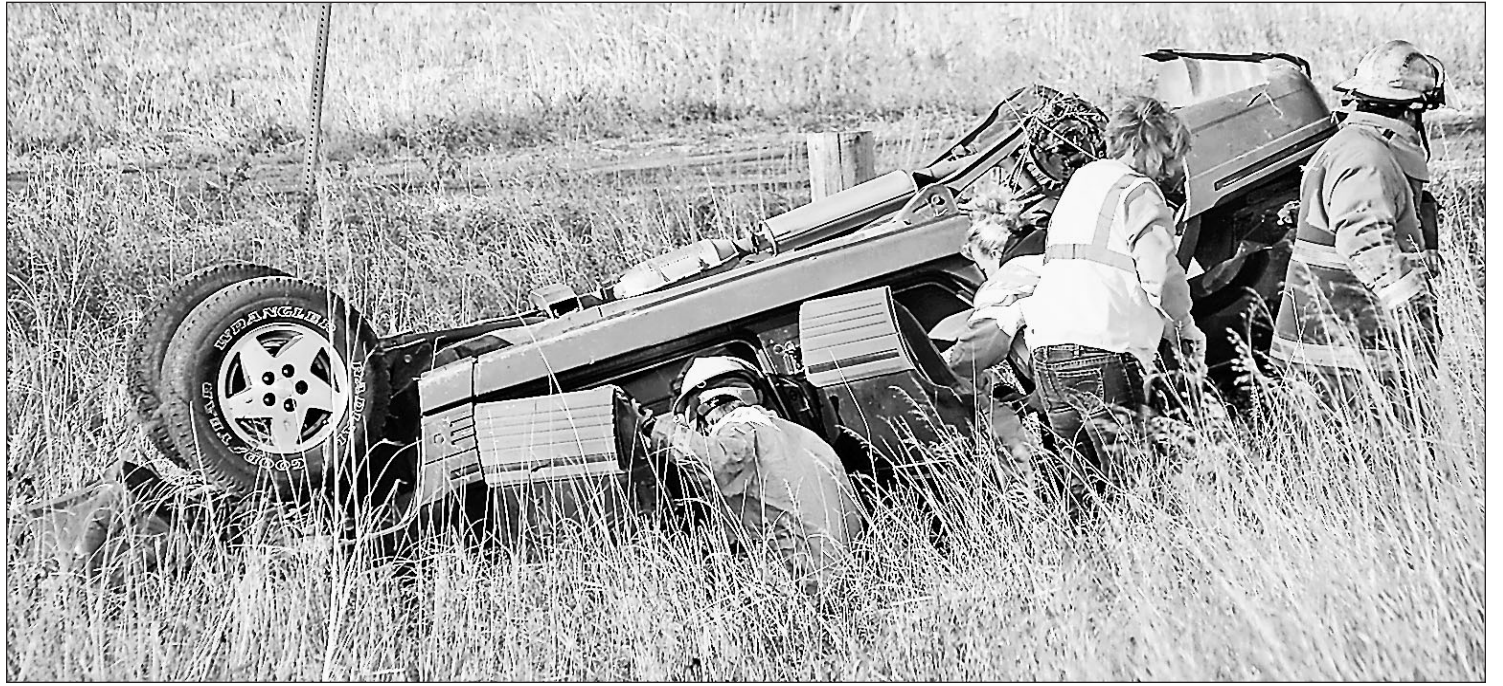
Periodic Table Focus Of Straub Lecture At USD

VERMILLION — The University of South Dakota will host professor and author John E. Straub, Ph.D., for the 2011 Phi Beta Kappa Visiting Scholar Lecture at 7 p.m. on Monday, Nov. 7, at Room 118, Churchill-Haines.

Straub's lecture, "A Lively Tour of the Periodic Table," will explore the diverse properties of the chemical elements through the use of historical accounts and chemical reactions. Additionally, the lecture and demonstration, open to the public, will also answer questions such as "what is the single most important statement of scientific knowledge? Or how were the chemical elements isolated from ancient times until the present day?"

Straub joined the department of chemistry at Boston University in 1990 where he is currently professor and chair. He is a recipient of the university's Gitner and Metcalf Awards, both for excellence in teaching. His research focuses on the development and use of mathematical and computational models to uncover the principles governing the fundamental processes of energy transfer, signaling, folding, misfolding, and aggregation that underlie protein function. He served as chair of the Theoretical Chemistry Subdivision of the American Chemical Society and as president of the Telluride Science Research Center, as well as on advisory panels to the Pinhead Institute, the National Science Foundation and the National Institutes of Health.
