MRI Director To Discuss 2011 Flood

VERMILLION — Tim Cowman, director of the Missouri River Institute at the University of South Dakota, will present "The Missouri River Flood of 2011: Causes, Impacts, and Post-flood Policy Decisions" at 7 p.m. on Wednesday, Nov. 9, at the Salsbury Science Center, Room 120 ("Z Hall"), on the campus of the University of Sioux Falls.

Cowman's presentation will discuss events that contributed to this year's historic flood, including how the mainstem reservoir system failed to handle these events. Impacts of the flood on river geo-

morphology, the riparian ecosystem and infrastructure built in the floodplain will also be discussed. The presentation will conclude by looking at mainstem reservoir and floodplain management alternatives that would reduce the impact of future floods and provide opportunities for ecosystem restoration.

In addition to serving as director of the Missouri River Institute at USD, Cowman is a Natural Resources Administrator with the SD Geological Survey. He has a master's degree in natural sciences from the University of South Dakota. His work includes research

on the geology and history of the Missouri River, with a focus on current and historical river geomorphology. He also studies the Missouri River steamboat era and was part of a team that conducted a survey of the North Alabama steamboat discovery.

Co-sponsored by the USD Missouri River Institute and Northern Prairies Land Trust, "The Missouri River Flood of 2011: Causes, Impacts, and Post-flood Policy Decisions" is free and open to the public.

D.M.A., assistant professor in voice/opera at USD, David Holdhusen, Ph.D., director of choral activities at USD, and Susan Keith Gray, D.M.A., professor of music at USD. More than 160 students are registered to attend the festival, which will include featured choral performances from the Brookings High School Concert Choir under the direction of Denise Perry and the Elk Point-Jefferson High School Concert Choir under the direction of Dustin Rusche.
