**50 YEARS AGO**  
**Friday, November 10, 1961**  
• Fire caused an estimated \$10,500 damage to the plant and office of the *Sioux City Press Dispatch*, a weekly newspaper early today. It was the second fire at the newspaper in recent months.

• The committee of selection for South Dakota of Rhodes scholars for 1961 will meet at Sioux Falls Dec. 13. At that time, they will select two candidates to appear before the district committee in Des Moines, Iowa.

**25 YEARS AGO**  
**Monday, November 10, 1986**  
• Yankton's first snowfall of the season, about an inch of the white stuff, fell in the Yankton area overnight. More snow and record low temperatures moved into the northern Plains today after the season's first major snow-storm closed highways, stranded travelers, killed six people and left hunters out in the cold on the first weekend of deer season.  
• Nebraskans repealed the mandatory seat belt law by a margin of about one-tenth of 1 percent, unofficial Associated Press figures show. The margin Saturday was 561 votes. Some absentee ballots were still uncounted, but not enough to reverse the outcome.
