Getting A Feel For The Game

I have a confession to make, I am a "learn-a-holic.'

Ask my wife, there isn't a book that I don't want to read, or some topic I don't want to research. I am not content with the titles and degrees that I have, I know there is more to learn. (By the way, my sweetheart and I have agreed, no

more formal education, no more

degrees.) Why would a person keep going to school? After all I have a good job; I am a pastor full time. I am a licensed therapist and I have an office full of books that keep me interested. But there is a mythology present that the more you know the more you can control things.


We have heard that haven't we that knowledge is power. The problem is that we have taken it to the extreme in the church, the more we know the more like Christ we will be! So if there is a seminar on successful Christian living we are all over it. If there is a sermon on TV or a Bible Study at church, we want to be a part.

After all the more you

I wonder, what did Jesus do with his disciples, was it a nonstop teaching event? Or did they walk and talk with him and watch and then do? Wasn't it recorded that he sent out the 72 (Matthew 10) with the orders to do what he had done?

What would happen if we shifted our thinking a bit from "book learning" to an apprenticeship?

One man has made this suggestion that the Christian life is more like being a baseball shortstop: A young player can watch videos, read books by the greatest shortstops of all time, and listen to coaches' lecture on what makes a good shortstop; but what will make him a truly good shortstop is getting out on the field and practicing. The only way he'll really get a feel for the game is to field ground ball after ground ball, to figure out when to play the ball on a short hop, when a pull-hitter is at bat, and

listening to a lecture. The way to learn how to be a Christian is to get out and practice the disciplines of the Christian

While there are many let me give you a few you might not be familiar with: hospitality, service, community, reflection, simplicity, secrecy and prayer. That is not exhaustive but illustrative. You see you cannot learn service and community by listening to someone preach or teach it is learned by doing.

Along the same line you cannot learn reflection and prayer by studying another lesson. It is learned by doing and as you do, you get a "feel" for the life lived with Christ. I have challenged my church leadership to read a

passage from the Bible every day. Not to get something from it, but to let the Bible begin to inform their thinking and their living. There is no quiz, nor points for completing the reading, or demerits for failing to follow through. What I am hoping is that as the Bible becomes part of their life that God will be able to help them fine tune their game at work, at home and at times when they are in the church building.

Today let me make a suggestion. Instead of asking your pastor/priest to lead another Bible Study or preach you another sermon, which by the way pastors and priests are good at; ask him what you can do to help someone else? Instead of asking what else can I learn, ask where can I get involved in serving people around me. What can I pray about, where is God showing me I can be of assistance to someone else.

If you try that I think you will begin to get a feel for the game, but this life in Christ is more than a game isn't it, it is about living in obedience to the God who has given us life through his Son Jesus Christ. So get off the bench and get into the game!
