Swiss Choral Society To Present Concert

FREEMAN — The Swiss Choral Society will present an evening of music by British composer Ralph Vaughan Williams at 8 p.m. Friday, Nov. 25, at the Salem Mennonite (South) Church. The church, southeast of Freeman, is located at 28103 443rd Avenue.

The Swiss Choral Society presented its first concert in 1932. Handel's Messiah was featured every year through 1956. With only one year off, the choir then began performing a variety of classical works in 1958. In addition to Messiah, the choir has performed works such as the Requiems of Mozart, Brahms, "Fauré and Rutter"; Mendelssohn's "Elijah," Haydn's "Creation," Vivaldi's "Gloria," Schubert's Masses, and several of Bach's works.

This year's concert will include several short choral works by Vaughan Williams but the featured work will be his cantata Dona Nobis Pacem. This plea for peace premiered in 1936 as Vaughan Williams' reaction to the horrors of World War I and in recognition of the growing tensions that ultimately led to World War II. The texts employed are the Agnus Dei of the Catholic Mass, poetry by Walt Whitman, an anti-war speech of John Bright, and the Biblical book of Jeremiah. Although the title is in Latin, most of the text is in English. Daniel Graber will conduct the choir with Sherilyn Ortman serving as pianist. Soloists will be Nanette Hofer, soprano, and Brandon Hendrickson, baritone.

A native of Freeman, Nanette

Hofer returns to Swiss Choral after last year's solo performance in Messiah. Nanette has been singing professionally since high school when she toured Europe with the musical theatre production Oklahoma. A sought-after soloist, Nanette sang solos in The Seven Last Words of Christ in Sioux Falls in 2009 and with the Powder River Symphony in both their 2011 spring Movie and Musicals concert and their upcoming Holiday Concert. Nanette received her BA in Music Education from the University of Sioux Falls, a Masters of Music in Vocal Performance & an MFA in Theatre Direction from the University of South Dakota. An educator as well as performer, Nanette currently is teaching in Gillette, Wyoming.

New to the area is Brandon Hendrickson, baritone. Professor of Voice and Opera, University of South Dakota, Vermillion, Dr. Hendrickson holds the degrees of Master of Music and Doctor of Musical Arts from Louisiana State University. In 2011 Hendrickson was a Regional Finalist of the Metropolitan Opera National Council Auditions in St. Paul, Minn. His recent credits include debuts with the Des Moines Metro Opera, Sounds of South Dakota, Louisiana Sinfonietta, Pensacola Opera, Opéra Louisiane, and The Dallas Opera. This fall he sang with the Southeast Pennsylvania Symphony Orchestra, the South Dakota Symphony Orchestra, and will debut with the Charleston Symphony Orchestra as the bass

soloist in Handel's Messiah. Daniel Graber is a 2008 graduate of Bethel College, North Newton, Kan., with degrees in both vocal and piano performance. He currently is director of music at both First Presbyterian Church and Spirit of Peace Church, UCC in Sioux Falls. Graber directed the Swiss Choral Society in performances of Handel's "Messiah" in 2010 and Mozart's "Requiem" in 2009. He continues to be active in the annual Schmeckfest musicals, most recently appearing as Fred in "Kiss Me, Kate!" Dan also teaches private clarinet lessons at Freeman Academy.

Sherilyn Ortman received her BA in Music from Bethel College where she taught private piano at Bethel's Academy of Music. In 1999 Sherilyn and her husband Will moved to Freeman, where she maintains a private studio and is active as an accompanist and church musician. Sherilyn has served Swiss Choral as rehearsal accompanist, rehearsal director, director and committee president. She and Will have three young sons and farm east of Freeman.

The concert has been awarded a project grant by the South Dakota Arts Council. Support for the Arts Council is provided by funds from the State of South Dakota, through the Department of Tourism, and the National Endowment for the Arts. The concert is free to the public but a free offering will be taken.

75 YEARS AGO

Thursday, November 19, 1936
 Mayor Ernest Crockett returned to Yankton last evening where he attended a water conservation meeting which was principally interested in the proposal to divert Missouri River waters near Mandan and direct them through the James River and reported that it was well that representatives of the Missouri River country were at the meeting from South Dakota in order to prevent diverting more than flood waters from the Missouri.

South Dakotans from the Missouri River country went on record as opposed to diverting any normal Missouri River flow, but would support diverting of flood waters as one means of keeping the Missouri within a definite channel with a series of dams on the Missouri for the purpose of irrigation and raising the water level of the country, which it was shown at the meeting had fallen 17 feet.

CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures traded mixed Friday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for December delivery rose 5.75 cents to \$5.9825 a bushel; December corn fell 4.25 cents to \$6.1025 a bushel; December oats rose 4 cents to \$3.04 a bushel; while January soybeans were unchanged at \$11.6825 a bushel.

Beef and pork futures also traded mixed on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

December live cattle fell 1.30 cent to \$1.1970 a pound; January feeder cattle fell 2.15 cents to \$1.4742 a pound; while December lean hogs rose 0.02 cent to 87.47 cents a pound.
