

Yankton Chiropractor Pleads Guilty To Fraud

A Yankton chiropractor has pleaded guilty to Medicare and Medicaid fraud. Larry Jones, 63, admitted recently as part of a plea agreement to making false claims to Medicare and Medicaid between the approximate dates of Jan. 1, 2005, and March 31, 2011, for two patients. He has an office at 1516 Broadway Avenue, and was arrested Nov. 3 for making false claims. The charge is a class 5 felony that carries a maximum penalty of five years in the South Dakota State Penitentiary and a \$10,000 fine. Among the stipulations of the agreement entered with the South Dakota Attorney General's Office, Jones has consented to writing apologies to all of the victims; re-

imbursing the state for the costs associated with investigating and prosecuting the case; and paying restitution to any victims, including amounts arising from any uncharged offense that is found to exist and subsequently disclosed to the defendant. In return, the state has agreed to refrain from filing any additional charges relating to Jones' prior fraud-related crimes and to inform the sentencing judge of the extent of his cooperation with authorities. Prior to the plea hearing, Jones was required to tender a certified check to the attorney general's office in the amount of \$2,633.92 that will be used to offset the restitution owed to the South Dakota Department of Social Services and private payers. A sentencing hearing has been set for Dec. 12.
