## Nebraska Woman Sues Over JFK Bestseller

LINCOLN, Neb. (AP) — A Nebraska woman who served on John F. Kennedy's presidential campaign claims a book-seller unlawfully used her name to advertise a rare, autographed copy of the novel "Revolutionary Road."

The pre-published, hard-back copy of the 1961 novel about a disillusioned Connecticut couple was autographed by author Richard Yates for Helen Abdouch.

The 84-year-old Omaha woman filed an invasion of privacy lawsuit in U.S. District Court of Nebraska. Abdouch alleges that Hadley, Mass.-based Ken Lopez Bookseller used her name and position in the Kennedy campaign to sell the book.

Abdouch was the executive secretary of John F. Kennedy's 1960 campaign in Nebraska. Yates had worked as a speechwriter for then-U.S. Attorney General Robert Kennedy, who managed his brother's presidential campaign.

Phone messages left with Lopez on Monday were not returned.

also with you,' but now it will be changed to 'And with your spirit.'

In other changes, the prayer that currently is "Holy, Holy, Holy, Lord God of power and might" will become "Holy, Holy, Holy, Lord God of hosts."

Also, the current "Lord, I am not worthy to receive you" will change to "Lord, I'm not worthy that you should come under my roof."

The new wording reflects the richness of what occurs during the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, Smith said. "The Mass is organic and ever changing," he said.

The Mass will remain the same sacrifice and celebrating, remaining valid under both the old and new wording, Smith said.

"Most of the parishes have been letting people know of the changes coming during the last four weeks," he said. "We preached the last four weeks on what the changes are and some of the music changes. The words will also have changes."

To the west, the Rev. Joe Forcelle has helped prepare his two parishes, St. Leo's in Tyndall and St. Vincent's in Springfield.

"We have been using a congregational response card for about a month now," he said. "Last weekend and this weekend, we are practicing some of the simple chant responses with the congregation."

Forcelle has taken other steps to help his parishioners with the transition.

"I have addressed it in homilies and have allowed members to look at the new books just to help them become more comfortable with them," he said.

"Our choir has been working on learning new music to be implemented next Sunday. Our worship aid in the pews will be an annual book printed by Oregon Catholic Press, which will contain all the new responses, Scripture readings and hymnal for a year."

Besides his two parishes, Forcelle serves another ministry as he celebrates Mass on Saturday mornings at Mike Durfee State Prison in Springfield. He has been working with the inmates on understanding the upcoming changes.

"I find (the prisoners) curious about things, but they are also adjusting easily," he said.

Parishioners won't be the only ones ad-

## Bond Set In Kidnapping Case

PIERRE (AP) — Bond has been set at \$25,000 cash for a South Dakota man accused of stealing a woman's car when she went inside a Pierre convenience store, and then crashing it with a 2-year-old girl in the back seat.

Jason Driving Hawk, of Pierre, made his first court appearance Monday afternoon. He's charged with kidnapping, grand theft, reckless driving and drunken driving.

Prosecutors say the bond is appropriate because of the nature of the charges and their contention that Driving Hawk has no ties to the area.

Osteen and Lashley were roommates and apparently fought over a remote control, Winder said.

There was a brief struggle, and then the altercation ended, Winder said. Lashley suffered injuries in the fight. Lashley was later found unresponsive and was pronounced dead at the Tyndall hospital.

No weapons were believed to have been used in the altercation, the DOC spokesman said.

Winder said he believes this was the first violent inmate death at Springfield, a low-medium security prison opened in the 1980s that houses non-violent offenders.

justing to the new wording, as the priests will also make changes.

"Most of the clergy have attended workshops in the Sioux Falls Diocese this past year in preparation, as have several musicians," Forcelle said.

"Bishop (Paul) Swain of the Sioux Falls Diocese has posted an audio message on the diocesan website for people to access regarding the New Roman Missal. We (played) it for the congregation at Masses (last) weekend."

Smith said the changes have caused him to step back and reflect on the words spoken during Mass.

"We (priests) get used to the repetition, and we know it by heart, so we are looking at why there is the distinction (with the new words)," he said.

Some changes may seem simple but have a profound meaning, Smith said. For example, changing the phrase "take away the sin of the world" to "take away the sins of the world" reflects a major truth, he said: Sin remains part of the world, but individual sins are forgiven.

The new wording may also change the cadence of prayers and music, which requires some adjustment in timing, Smith said.

Forcelle also sees the clergy needing to learn alongside their parishioners.

"I would certainly think that this will be more of an adjustment for the priests and deacons than for the congregation," he said. "All of the major Eucharistic prayers have been re-translated, and the ones for use with children have been adjusted for adults instead."

"It has taken time to learn the new wording, and the phrasing is sometimes more challenging."

However, Forcelle also finds the changes have presented him with a new way of looking at the Mass.

"I personally find doing this adjusting to be helping me get re-connected with the Mass," he said. "Doing things for (more than) 30 years by rote has led me to sometimes become robotic in my presiding. I'm actually surprised that I am enjoying the changes. This refreshed attitude in me seems to be spreading to the members of my parishes."

Smith agreed, noting the changes are allowing Catholics to take another look at the reasons for certain words or actions during the Mass.

The changes are guided by a higher power, Smith said.

"We are persons of Christ, who came for our sins," he said. "With these changes, the Holy Spirit is guiding us. You trust that."
