

The pre-published, hardback copy of the 1961 novel about a disillusioned Connecticut couple was autographed by author Richard Yates for Helen Abdouch. The 84-year-old Omaha

woman filed an invasion of privacy lawsuit in U.S. District Court of Nebraska. Abdouch alleges that Hadley, Mass.-based Ken Lopez Bookseller used her name and position in the Kennedy Campaign to Sen the book. Abdouch was the execu-

In other changes, the prayer that currently is "Holy, Holy, Holy, Lord God of power and might" will become "Holy, Holy, Holy, Lord God of hosts.

Also, the current "Lord, I am not worthy to receive you" will change to "Lord, I'm not worthy that you should come under my roof.

The new wording reflects the richness of what occurs during the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, Smith said. "The Mass is organic and ever changing," he said.

The Mass will remain the same sacrifice and celebrating, remaining valid under both the old and new wording, Smith said. "Most of the parishes have been letting

people know of the changes coming during the last four weeks," he said. "We preached the last four weeks on what the changes are and some of the music changes. The words will also have changes.' To the west, the Rev. Joe Forcelle has

helped prepare his two parishes, St. Leo's in Tyndall and St. Vincent's in Springfield.

"We have been using a congregational response card for about a month now," he said. Last weekend and this weekend, we are practicing some of the simple chant responses with the congregation.

Forcelle has taken other steps to help his parishioners with the transition.

"I have addressed it in homilies and have allowed members to look at the new books just to help them become more comfortable with them," he said.
