phones and mobile phones.

"To me, this is the proper use of those funds," County Commissioner Mark Johnson said.

In other business Tuesday, the commission:

- entered an agreement with Dr. Scott Hiltunen of Avera Sacred Heart Hospital to be the medical director for the Yankton County Emergency Medical Services;
- discussed purchasing laptop computers or some other computing device to eliminate the need for large packets of paper for every meeting;
- discussed the possibility of using the current county Highway Shop for storage purposes once the new facility is complete;
- approved a job description for the position of corporal in the sheriff's office; and
- approved an approximately \$25,000 agreement with Johnson Engineering for work on Stone Church Road.

Crowe sent out SS-5 forms to all employers of the city for distribution to employees to fill out and return either to the employer or to the postmaster. These forms, which are the application numbers, must be in the hands of the postmaster before December 5 of this year.
