

# **Lake Andes Man Sentenced For Rapes**

SIOUX FALLS — A Lake Andes man has been sentenced to 30 years in prison without parole after being convicted in federal court of three

According to a Department of Justice press release, James Bruguier (a k a, James Bruguier Jr.) was sentenced Monday in Sioux Falls by a federal jury.

In August, Bruguier was convicted of aggravated sexual abuse, sexual abuse, sexual abuse of a minor, and first-degree burglary for separate sexual assaults on an adult and two teenagers from the Yankton Sioux Reservation. According to trial testimony, two of the sexual attacks occurred in homes of the victims. The three incidents took place in 2004-2005, 2010 and 2011.

Bruguier was originally indicted last February by a federal grand jury, and was then re-indicted as more victims were discovered.


