Boulder, Colo., and four performances this past April in Schweiklberg, Germany; Linz and Vienna in Austria.

The Yankton Children's Choir will perform Dec. 8. This group of 20 young singers are under the direction of Deb Kruse with Dixie Church as accompanist. In addition to their regular winter and spring concerts, they perform at Skyforce and Mount Marty College basketball games; they entertained at the Redlin Art Center in Watertown this past spring; they perform in Pierre's capitol rotunda the annual tree festival (and will perform there Dec. 11). They have performed twice with the South Dakota Syphony. In the

last couple of years, they have sung for three Habitat for Humanity dedications.

Trumpeter Scott Olson winds up the 2011 series, performing Dec. 15. Scott is principle trumpet with the South Dakota Symphony; he is adjunct professor of trumpet at Augustana, Dordt and Northwestern colleges and conducts a jazz band at Dordt. He can also be found at most times of the year aboard a tractor on his Mission Hill farm. He will be accompanied on piano and organ by Marilyn Nyberg.

Dr. Ball To Speak On Health Of Flood Impacted Trees And Shrubs

South Dakota State University Forestry Specialist Dr. John Ball will present on the impact the summer's flood had on the area's shrubs and trees Friday, Dec. 2 from 5:30-6:30 p.m. at Stoney Creek Inn, 300 Third St., Sioux City, Iowa. This presentation will be held following the Tri-State Fruit and Vegetable Growers Symposium being hosted by Extension services in Iowa, South Dakota and Nebraska.

Ball will address short-term and long-term health of trees in city parks and on private property affected by flooding. This session on flood recovery is free to attend and everyone is welcome.

Ball will also present at the fruit and vegetable growers conference

which will be held from noon-5:15 p.m. providing an overview of specialty crops.

Other topics to be covered during the conference include fruit trees, aronia berries, grapes, ethnic vegetable varieties, organic insect and pest control, and community supported agriculture strategies.

The symposium and flood recovery presentation is planned in partnership with Iowa State University (ISU) Extension and Outreach, University of Nebraska Extension, and South Dakota State University Extension.
