YANKTON WASTEWATER IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT

The City of Yankton is seeking up to \$3.7 million of funding from the Board of Water and Natural Resources for the East Highway 50 Wastewater Lift Station Proiect. The proposed lift station will replace two lift stations that currently serve southeast Yankton. Included in the project is construction of gravity sewer mains from the location of the two existing lift stations to the new lift station site, and construction of a force main to carry wastewater from the new site to Yankton's wastewater treatment plant.

State Awards Grants To Area Hospitals

PIERRE — Fifteen rural hospitals in South Dakota will receive a total of \$201,880 in grants for projects ranging from medication error reduction to telehealth.

The grant funding comes to the Department of Health through the federal Medicare Rural Hospital Flexibility Program. During the last 11 years, South Dakota has awarded more than \$3,800,000 to rural hospitals through the program.

To be eligible, hospitals must have received a Medicare certification as a Critical Access Hospital (CAH). Hospitals certified as CAHs receive a higher Medicare reimbursement rate and are eligible for grant funding for such projects as enhanced information systems. South Dakota currently has 38 critical access hospitals.
