NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING for the **YANKTON WASTEWATER IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT**

The City of Yankton is seeking up to **\$3.7 million** of funding from the Board of Water and Natural Resources for the East Highway 50 Wastewater Lift Station Project. The proposed lift station will replace two lift stations that currently serve southeast Yankton. Included in the project is construction of gravity sewer mains from the location of the two existing lift stations to the new lift station site, and construction of a force main to carry wastewater from the new site to Yankton's wastewater treatment plant.

The funds could be either a grant from the state Consolidated Water Facilities Construction Program or a loan from the Clean Water State Revolving Fund (SRF) Program. The expected Clean Water SRF loan terms are 3.0 percent for 20 years, and the Board of Water and Natural Resources may forgive all or a portion of the loan principal. The amount, source of funds, and terms will be determined by the Board of Water and Natural Resources when the application is presented at a scheduled board meeting. The purpose of the public hearing is to discuss the proposed project, the proposed financing, and the source of repayment for the loan. The public is invited to attend and comment on the project.

The public hearing will be held at the City of Yankton Community Meeting Room, Technical Education Center, 1200 West 21st Street, Yankton, South Dakota, on Monday December 12, 2011 at 7:00 P.M. Please contact the City at 668-5221 if you have any questions about the hearing.

State Awards Grants To Area Hospitals

PIERRE — Fifteen rural hospitals in South Dakota will receive a total of \$201,880 in grants for projects ranging from medication error reduction to telehealth.

The grant funding comes to the Department of Health through the federal Medicare Rural Hospital Flexibility Program. During the last 11 years, South Dakota has awarded more than \$3,800,000 to rural hospitals through the program.

To be eligible, hospitals must have received a Medicare certification as a Critical Access Hospital (CAH). Hospitals certified as CAHs receive a higher Medicare reimbursement rate and are eligible for grant funding for such projects as enhanced information systems. South Dakota currently has 38 critical access hospitals. Sustaining essential healthcare

services in rural and underserved areas is a key objective of the department's Health 2020 Initiative.

The Better Business Bureau is warning businesses to beware of a malicious email that pretends to be from the BBB, and concerns a complaint filed against the company.

The phishing email is sent from multiple email addresses with the subject line "Complaint #" followed by a nine-digit number. BBB Accredited and Non-Accredited Businesses have been targeted and some consumers have received the email. The body of the email claims that the company has received a complaint and asks them to respond to the complaint by directing them to a link shown as our national website at http://www.bbb.org which actually is a disguised link to a third party website. The link given actually goes to the site caxehid.getfreehosting.co.uk/. Since the message is fraudulent,

the BBB advises any business that receives this email to take the following steps:

- Do not click on any links or reply to the message. Completely delete the message from your inbox, and run a full virus scan on your computer if you did click on any links
- If you receive an email from the BBB about a complaint filed against your business and need assistance in determining whether or not it is legitimate, contact the BBB Serving Nebraska, South Dakota, and southwest Iowa at 800-649-6814. Complaints handled by the BBB Serving Nebraska, South Dakota and Southwest Iowa always begin with "3000," and never include an attachment unless requested by the company
