essary. That work is expected to cost between \$3,000-\$5,000.

"We're going to transform that into a more suitable meeting space," Russell said.

The money will come from the city's building maintenance fund. Commissioners unanimously approved the proposal.

"I think it's a great use of the space (in City Hall) to better utilize that for staff," Commissioner Nancy Wenande said.

Commissioner Paul Lowrie added that, "I like that we're using some of that space that the fire department formerly used. Maybe there are some other nooks and

crannies that we can use for other things, too."

In other business, the commission agreed to create a committee to review the compensation of its members.

Yankton city commissioners are among the lowest paid in first-class South Dakota cities. Discussions have been had during recent annual budget sessions about possibly raising the stipend paid to commissioners, but action has never followed.

Creation of the committee was proposed by Mayor David Knoff.

"I thought some or all of the commissioners could sit down and discuss if we want to bring (the topic) to a regular meeting," he said.

Also Monday, the commission held an executive session to discuss contract negotiations and litigation.
