

# **Creighton Man Dies From Gunshot Wound**

CREIGHTON, Neb. - A Creighton, Neb., man has been found dead as the result of a selfinflicted gunshot wound, according to Knox County (Neb.) Attorney John Thomas.

Michael Rudloff, 47, was reported missing since last weekend, Thomas said Tuesday in a press release.

State Patrol was asked to help search for Rudloff, as he had not been seen since 8:30 a.m. that morning. The search, which continued

Sunday, was conducted by the Nebraska State Patrol, assisted by the Creighton Fire and EMS, Verdigre (Neb.) Fire and EMS, the Antelope County (Neb.) sheriff's office, the Knox County sheriff's office and the Creighton and Verdigre police departments.

Rudloff's body was found at an unoccupied farm site about seven miles west of Creighton.

Monday, November 30, 1936 • For "causing persons to be held as res," Paul D. Peacher, former slaves. deputy sheriff of Earle, Ark., was placed on trial in U.S. court at Jonesboro, Ark. A grand jury, invoking the Federal Anti-Slavery Statute of 1866, charged Peacher with falsely arresting eight Negroes and having them clear land for him after they had been "illegally" sentenced for vagrancy. It was the second time since the Civil War that the statute had been invoked.

On a different front, he expressed hope that a referral effort regarding legislation that will establish a Large Project Development Fund in 2013 will be short-circuited in the 2012 Legislature. The fund was created by legislation approved earlier this year and will replace a program that sunsets at the end of 2012 that automatically refunds a portion of the sales and excise taxes



Waln, the wife of the tribal Chairman Rodney Bordeaux, said the Rosebud reservation's isolated location and limited housing and education options make it hard for clinics and hospitals to recruit specialists. The added transportation option could allow a specialist to live and work in Sioux Falls while also putting in regular time at a reservation hospital, she said.

"If they can be flown in for four days at a time and flown back out, I see that as a win-win situation for our people," Waln said. Warnock said his company is

looking at starting similar services at other sites on the northern Plains, along the Great Lakes and in the northern Mountain states.

"It's a model we're going to roll out," he said.


