Creighton Man Dies From Gunshot Wound

CREIGHTON, Neb. — A Creighton, Neb., man has been found dead as the result of a self-inflicted gunshot wound, according to Knox County (Neb.) Attorney John Thomas. Michael Rudloff, 47, was reported missing since last weekend, Thomas said Tuesday in a press release. On Saturday, the Nebraska State Patrol was asked to help search for Rudloff, as he had not been seen since 8:30 a.m. that morning. The search, which continued Sunday, was conducted by the Nebraska State Patrol, assisted by the Creighton Fire and EMS, Verdigre (Neb.) Fire and EMS, the Antelope County (Neb.) sheriff's office, the Knox County sheriff's office and the Creighton and Verdigre police departments. Rudloff's body was found at an unoccupied farm site about seven miles west of Creighton.

ON THIS DATE

75 YEARS AGO

Monday, November 30, 1936

• For "causing persons to be held as slaves," Paul D. Peacher, former deputy sheriff of Earle, Ark., was placed on trial in U. S. court at Jonesboro, Ark. A grand jury, invoking the Federal Anti-Slavery Statute of 1866, charged Peacher with falsely arresting eight Negroes and having them clear land for him after they had been "illegally" sentenced for vagrancy. It was the second time since the Civil War that the statute had been invoked.

• Peter Azure, 12, Indian boy who was horribly cut and mangled in the bread mixer at Marty died at the Dugan hospital several hours after the accident. He and another boy were cleaning the blades of the mixer. Peter called to his companion to turn the wheel over so he could reach the other blades. Instead of turning the wheel by hand the boy turned on the switch and Peter was caught in the path of the blades.
