the way it is funded is a significant concern of our citizens.

2. With an initiated measure on the 2012 general election ballot that proposes to increase the state general sales and use tax rate from 4 percent to 5 percent to, in part, help fund K-12, there is some uncertainty in regards to the future of education funding. What do you think of current funding levels, and what is the way forward?

Initiated measure 15 that proposes to increase the sales tax to help fund education and Medicaid will be determined by the voters. We are consistently receiving mandates from the federal government that affect both of these areas without adequate funding to support their programs. South Dakotans have traditionally been against anything that raises taxes and this proposal is a 25% tax increase at a time when we are experiencing the worst drought in decades. I would expect this measure to be soundly defeated.

#### 3. The general election ballot will include Referred Law 14, which would determine whether or not the Large Project Development Fund will be formed to assist with the construction of economic development projects. Is this fund needed? Why or why not?

Referred Law 14 to establish the Large Project Development Fund will also be determined by the voters. 22 % of the Contractor's Excise Tax estimated to be \$15 to \$17 million would be used to attract businesses that help keep our students here in South Dakota with better paying quality jobs. Is this needed to attract businesses and help business expand? I believe that in order for a small state like ours to compete, we have to have added incentives like this development fund to level the playing field.

#### 4. Do you think South Dakota's economy is heading in the right direction?

Based upon sales tax receipts, certainly the economy in South Dakota is headed in a positive direction. The state's largest industry, agriculture had been fairing quite well until this awful drought. What impact that will have as we move forward certainly is a negative for our economy. Can and should the state do more for all the sectors of our economy? I feel that anything the state can do should be done to develop and promote agriculture and its related industries as well as tourism, manufacturing, retail, ethanol, wind energy, mining, finance, and the service industries.

5. Scientists link the increasing frequency of extreme weather events such as last year's flood and this year's drought to the effects of climate change, yet the issue has been largely ignored at the federal and state levels. Should the Legislature take any measures to address the growing impacts of climate change?

If indeed these extreme weather events continue to plague us, we will need to address its effect on our infrastructure. Just as Referred Law 14 is an investment in economic development, perhaps an investment in a catastrophic fund may be necessary to minimize the impact of these climatological events.

# 6. Final thoughts?

I bring experience in the regulatory aspect of state government serving 9 years on the Board of Chiropractic Examiners as the investigative office for all consumer complaints and chairman of peer review. I have met with the Division of Insurance, the Department of Social Services, and the State Health Department in Pierre every year for the past 7 years. I have the ability to listen, weigh out the impact of a proposal, and the act with common sense.
