75 YEARS AGO

Tuesday, November 2, 1937

- A. C. Ellerman, of the contracting firm of Ellerman and McLain, which was awarded the contract for installing a water main from Yankton to the state hospital north of town, stated that it is expected to start excavating for the main within the next three or four days.
- Frank Stetler, farmer, residing two miles west of Olivet suffered serious injuries and narrowly escaped death when he was dragged more than 50 rods by a tractor with plows attached. While driving to the field he reached for a lever and losing his balance fell over backwards.

50 YEARS AGO

Friday, November 2, 1962

- The peacetime vocational rehabilitation bill will benefit nearly 900 peace time veterans in South Dakota who

have suffered service-connected disabilities.

- For the fifth time in nine years, the Nebraska Safety Patrol has earned first place honors in a National Safety Council competition for state police.

25 YEARS AGO

Monday, November 2, 1987

bushel.

December live cattle rose 0.10 cent to \$1.2542 a pound; November feeder cattle rose 0.25 cent to \$1.4490 a pound; while December lean hogs fell 0.12 cent to 77.75 cents a pound.

- Broomtree Retreat and Conference Center, 29827 446th Ave., Irene; and
- the Lesterville Fire Hall, Lesterville.

The other old polling stations will no longer be open on Election Day.
