MATCHUPS

COYOTE OFFENSE VS. UNI DEFENSE

Northern Iowa's defense has dominated in two of the last three weeks. The Panthers held SDSU to two field goals and shut out Western Illinois last week. The Coyotes, meanwhile, haven't put together a good offensive guarter since the first half at Missouri State — almost a month ago.




Last week was a step in the right direction for the USD defense, but it will face a huge test today in UNI quarterback Sawyer Kollmorgen. He threw three TD passes last week, but the rushing attack ran for 303 yards. Which area does USD key on?

SPECIAL TEAMS

Northern Iowa is the nation's second best, statistically, in kickoff returns with an average of 26.25 yards. If the Covotes can force the Panthers to start deep in their own territory, USD's defense could be able to slow them down.

Both teams are playing for nothing more than pride at this point. Neither will fin-

Quick Hitters

■ The 99th matchup between the Jackrabbits and Bison will be one of the biggest in recent memory. The winner of the game will clinch a share of the Missouri Valley Football Conference title.

■ The Bison come into today's game ranked first in both major national polls. The Jackrabbits last faced a #1-ranked NDSU team was in 2007, when SDSU upended the Bison 29-24.

■ NDSU junior quarterback Brock Jensen ranks second in Bison History in both completions (422) and passing yards (5,233). He trails Steve Walker (2004-07) in both categories.

■ SDSU sophomore running back Zach Zenner still leads the nation in yards per game (166.2), but has been stiffled in recent weeks, gaining just 87 yards against Youngstown State and 49 yards last week against Southern Illinois. He has had season lows in four consecutive

■ After a slow start, SDSU quarterback Austin Sumner is starting to heat up. The sophomore from Brandon threw for 351 yards and five touchdowns against Youngstown State, then was 26-45 passing for 284 and a score as the Jackrabbits rallied past Southern Illinois.

■ With six catches for 80 yards last week, SDSU wide receiver Tyrel Kool is up to 120 catches for his career. The senior from Yankton, who started at running back for the Jackrabbits a year ago, is tied for eighth with current teammate Aaron Rollin on the career receptions chart.

■ The Bison are used to packing Fargodome, drawing over 18,000 fans to 12 of its last 13 home games. Earlier this season against Youngstown State, NDSU packed 19,065 into their home stadium. This game is considered a sellout, though additional reserved or standing room tickets may have become available on Friday.

Key Matchup

NDSU Defensive Front vs. Zach **Zenner:** The Bison have held opponents to just under 65 yards a game defensively this season. SDSU sophomore Zach Zenner is the FCS leader in rushing yards per game at 166.2 per contest. Whoever wins this matchup will likely win the game.

■ Penn State, ineligible to play in the Big Ten title game, is going for its fourth conference road win. ■ Nittany Lions QB Matt McGloin has

thrown for 200-plus yards in a schoolrecord seven straight games. He has passed for 2,436 yards (most in the Big Ten) and 18 touchdowns.

■ Penn State DT Jordan Hill (knee) and TE Kyle Carter (foot) have been listed as day-to-day. Nebraska's Burkhead (knee) hadn't practiced as of mid-week.
