

• Yankton's Fifth Annual Electrical Show will open next Wednesday evening in the city hall auditorium with twenty-three firms co-operating, eighteen from Yankton, four from Sioux City and one from Sioux Falls. According to final plans, everything electrical for the home will be on exhibition to permit close study by all visitors.

Soldier Tells Students About Veterans

Capt. Eli Carr gave Veterans Day presentations to all classes at Yankton's Beadle School on Friday, Nov. 9. She shared many of her experiences with children and compared active duty to how we deal with bullies in school. She said part of their job is to "teach mean people not to be mean." Capt. Carr also shared with children the best way to thank a veteran: the salute. She explained that the salute is a sign of respect and that it can also mean "thank you." She encouraged children to find a veteran during Veteran's Day weekend and practice their salute. In closing, Capt. Carr demonstrated the correct way to fold a flag and to never let it touch the ground. Captain Carr's visit was arranged through the Joe Foss Institute.
