

CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures traded mixed Friday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for December delivery fell 7.50 cents to \$8.38 a bushel; December corn rose 5.75 cents to \$7.27 a bushel; December oats were unchanged at \$3.6450 a bushel; while January soybeans fell 18.75 cents to \$13.8325 a bushel.

Beef futures and pork futures rose on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

December live cattle rose 0.55 cent to \$1.2615 a pound; January feeder cattle rose 0.45 cent to \$1.4560 a pound; while December lean hogs rose 0.25 cent to 80.32 cents a pound.

SCOTLAND — Rep. Frank Kloucek (D-Scotland) says he is endorsing Rep. Stace Nelson and Sen.-Elect Bill Van Gerpen for key Republican leadership positions in the state house and Senate.

Kloucek was defeated by Van Gerpen in the District 19 Senate race. He said his support of the two Republicans is serious and intends to "bring harmony to the majority party."

"It's time that they both take a more active leadership role and a more active role in the party," Kloucek told the Press & Dakotan Friday.

"Stace has wanted this for a long time and Bill has wanted to be a senator since I defeated him last time. It's time they step up to the plate and work for the good of the party and state."
