That relieved a lot of stress." Some call-ups, such as for natural disasters, allow little or no prior notice to employers, Auch

"There could be a blizzard, and we had units called up last year when the Missouri River flooded. Not too long ago, we had units called up for six weeks," he said. "I could get scheduled for Guard duty on short notice. I usually don't know if we're doing anything until five or six days before. If anything comes up, then (my employers) work with me."

Now married, Auch has found the employer support even more of a stress relief for his family.

"Brett and Dan didn't even know about the award until they

were presented with it," Auch said. "They weren't expecting anything. It's just the way they run the company. Work is important, but family is first."

The ESGR award provides an important "thank you" to employers, Auch said. "It's a token of gratitude for treating their soldiers the way they do," he said.

Kennedy, the firm's director of the survey and mapping department, found the ESGR award "gratifying.' "We have had people in the

armed forces working for us for years. We have people in both the Guards and Reserve," he said. "They have a history in our country of defending our rights, and we support all of them and their family members. We appreciate what they go through.'

The firm plans its workload to

accommodate the military employees' absences, reworking the schedule if needed, Kennedy said. The company considers it a small price compared to the contributions of the military, he said.
