Omaha Gross Tops Norris 14-7 In Class B Title Game

LINCOLN, Neb. (AP) — Anthony Vigneri ran 25 times for 104 yards and scored the go-ahead touchdown to lead No. 4 Omaha Gross to its first state football championship with a 14-7 victory over No. 7 Norris in the Class B final Tuesday night.

Vigneri's 2-yard touchdown late in the third quarter came at the end of a 16-play, 63-yard drive that chewed more than 7 minutes off the clock.

Vigneri had scored on a 3-yard run in the second quarter for the first points of the game, but Gross missed the extra point.

Norris took a 7-6 lead into halftime after Jackson Reetz threw a 37-yard TD pass to Byron Hood.

Zach Johnk completed 8 of 13 passes for 62 yards for the Cougars

(12-1). James Kruger led Norris (10-3) with 103 yards on 24 carries. Reetz was 7 of 15 for 81 yards, with one interception.

NDSU Men's Golf Coach Resigns

FARGO, N.D. — North Dakota State men's golf coach Billy Iverson has resigned.

NDSU Director of Athletics Gene Taylor said an interim coach will be hired for the remainder of the year, and that a search for a new head men's golf coach will begin in April 2013.

Iverson, the assistant golf professional at Oxbow (N.D.) Country Club, was in his ninth season as head men's golf coach at North Dakota State.

Iverson has spent 16 years at Oxbow Country Club (1985-1988, 2001-present). He also worked as a golf professional in California at Burlingame Country Club, Saticoy Country Club and Eldorado Country Club.

A native of Moorhead, Minn., Iverson played collegiate golf at Minnesota State Moorhead.
