Freedom Store Donates To Program

Freedom Valu Centers of Yankton and Erickson Oil Products, headquartered in Hudson, Wis., have announced the contribution of \$4,539 to the Folds of Honor Foundation. Folds of Honor support military families by providing scholarships and other opportunities for dependents of fallen or injured US soldiers (<http://www.foldsofhonor.org/>).

Anheuser Busch makers of Budweiser are the major sponsor of Folds of Honor. During a six week long 2012 campaign, Freedom Valu Center pledged to donate 25 cents a case for every case of Budweiser sold in their stores located in Wisconsin, South Dakota, Michigan and Minnesota.

evening."

Simpson said sales were stronger than last year, with 200-300 people showing up for the first opening, and 300-400 people showing up for the re-opening. The most popular items were electronics, small appliances and toys.

The weather was also comparable to last year, Somsen said. "Last year the weather was around 50 degrees. This year, Thursday was really nice, but then it became bitterly cold Friday morning," he said. "I'm not sure what the rest of the weekend will be like, but we've still had a great turnout."

Sandi Ahrlin has worked on Black Friday at JCPenney for three straight years and said this year was the busiest.

"It's been insane, but a good insane," she said. "This year's turnout was better than last year, especially since we changed the pricing of some items and we started doing a project with promotions with pins and buttons to give away until Christmas."

Ahrlin said people usually come out for appliances and luggage, and this year customers responded well to the sales.

"Things are really cheap right now with all of the deals, and people really respond to that. It does feel like a workout when you work on Friday — I've mainly been coasting through the day. I can't imagine actually shopping on Friday. I don't think I could do it."

The owners of Yankton Rexall in the downtown district also saw decent traffic through their store, even though they don't have many specials for Black Friday.

Owner Dan Somsen said he and Michael Kuchta promoted their toy shop this year, which was one reason they saw more

traffic. People also appreciate a less stressful environment, he said.

"We're a gift shop — we don't really have a lot of specials geared toward the madness that comes along with Black Friday," he said. "Most people head over to our shop after they've been to the big places like Walmart and Kmart."

"A number of people who don't want to deal with all the business come to our shop. We've always focused on customer service. We still do the complimentary wrapping and produce good products for a fair price. We want to make our customers happy."

Somsen said they are looking forward to the holiday season, especially the two weeks before Christmas, when their sales tend to pick up.
