sports Dell Rapids Dominates 11A All-State Team Schepper caught 39 passes for 840 yards

When a team wins a football state championship game with a 47-0 blowout, you can bet that there are some talented individuals on that squad. That is the case with Dell Rapids, as the Quarriers placed six individuals on the Class 11A

All-State Team to lead all squads. Those players include five seniors who guided Dell Rapids to an 11-1 record and their third state title in a row, along with sophomore sensation Riley Schmidt. Schmidt was selected as the special teams player, as he averaged over 32 yards on kick returns and nearly 22 yards on 12 punt returns.

"Riley is an electric player and made big plays in all aspects of the game - offense, defense and special teams," Dell Rapids head coach Steven Hansen said.

Schmidt led the Quarriers in all-purpose yards (1407) and touchdowns (15). State title game runner-up Harrisburg placed four individuals in the All-State squad, while Dakota Valley and Tea each had four players named. West Central and Spearfish rounded out the teams with multiple players being named, with three apiece.

Teams are chosen by the South Dakota football coaches Association and released by the South Dakota Sportswriters Association.

Twenty-six of the 28 individuals selected are seniors, with Schmidt (So.) and Tea Area's Cooper Hansen (Jr.) the lone non-seniors chosen. Offense

Quarterback: Andrew McCuen, Harrisburg. McCuen led the Tigers to the DakotaDome with 1600 yards passing and 891 yards rushing along with 28 total touchdowns (16 passing, 12 rush-

ing). "Andrew is a great player but an even better human being," Harrisburg coach

Brandon White said. "He has been our leader offensively for two years and is the face of Tiger football."

Fullback: Cole Langer, Dell Rapids. The 245-pound bruiser rushed 91 times for 800 yards - 8.8 average - and 13 touchdowns for the state champion Quarriers. 2012 is the third consecutive year that Langer has been named to the 11A All-State team.

"Cole is the smartest player I have ever coached," Hansen said. "Not only is he a great football player but he is a great athlete and an even better kid who treats everybody with respect."

Running Backs: Tanner Lambert, Dakota Valley. Lambert led the Panthers with 1,759 rushing yards on 255 attempts - 6.9 average - and also scored 17 touchdowns. He is a repeat 11A All-State selection.

'Tanner is by far one of the most physical players I have ever coached," coach Jason Jund said. "He was our

team MVP and holds every possible rushing record at DV. He is tied with is brother Taylor for the best our school has ever seen."

Nate Rotert, Spearfish. Rotert led the Spartans to the 11A semifinals with 15 touchdowns. He had 127 carries for 1245 yards (9.8 average) and 19 receptions for 199 yards (10.5 average).

"Nate has been our go to guy for the last two seasons - amassing over 2500 yards," coach Bruce Bresee said.

Wide Receivers: Mitchell Nissen, Tea Area. He led the Titans with 26 receptions for 517 yards (19.9 yard per catch) and three touchdowns.

"Mitchell was our outside/vertical threat and any team that played us knew they had to know where he was on the field," coach Craig Clayberg said. "He has great hands, runs good routs and really takes pride in his blocking, which sprung a lot of long runs for our backs." Trevor DeSchepper, Harrisburg. DeSchepper caught 39 passes for 840 yards (21.5 average) and 12 touchdowns. "Trevor became one of the premier

wide receivers in class 11A and has been one of our great leaders the past two seasons," coach White said.

Tight End: Bryce Koch, Dell Rapids. Koch caught 16 passes for 470 yards (29.4 average) and seven touchdowns.

"Bryce is a big target with great hands," coach Hansen said. Offensive Tackles: Nick Buckley,

Dakota Valley. Buckley was a key blocker for over 3500 yards of total offense for the Panthers.

"Nick is the ultimate team player," coach Jund said. "He never quit and made play after play for us despite being undersized each week.

Rvan Radzak, Harrisburg. He anchored the line for an explosive Tigers team that reached the 11A state finals.

Report: Denver To Join Summit League

The Summit League appears ready to make a literal move toward its name — into the Rocky Mountains.

The University of Denver, a school without a football program, will join the 9-team Summit League starting in 2013, according to a report Monday by CBS Sports.

The school later Monday an-nounced a press conference today (Tuesday) at 1 p.m. Central, only saying that it regards "conference affiliation."

University of South Dakota athletic director David Sayler said in a text message to the *P&D* that as of Monday evening, he hadn't received word from the Summit League on any addition.

By reaching into the Mountain Time Zone and adding Denver, the Summit League would boast 10 schools for the 2013-14 seasons. Already in the conference are Fort Wayne, IUPUI, Kansas City, Nebraska-Omaha, North Dakota State, Oakland, South Dakota, South Dakota State and Western Illinois.

Denver joined the Western Athletic Conference (WAC) in July after leaving the Sun Belt Conference last season. Joining the Summit would mean DU would be in a third league in three years.

The Pioneers joined the WAC in 2012 after spending 13 years in the Sun Belt. But departures within the WAC ranks — the league would be down to four schools for 2014 — made another change likely. A private school located just south of downtown Denver, DU is mostly known as a hockey powerhouse. The Pioneers own seven NCAA titles in that sport. Denver sponsors hockey, gymnastics and lacrosse, but the Summit League does not offer those sports.

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. (AP) — Jarnell Stokes scored 19 points and went 7-of-8 from the floor Monday as Tennessee relied on suffocating defense to roll to a 77-50 victory over cold-shooting Oakland.

Oakland shot just 28.6 percent (16-of-56) overall and went 2-of-16 from 3-point range. The Golden Grizzlies (2-5) were coming off a 70-52 loss at Michigan State on Friday in which they shot 27.6 percent (16-of-58), their worst field-goal percentage since joining the Division I ranks in 1999.

Trae Golden added 18 points and seven assists with only one turnover for the Volunteers (4-1). Tennessee shot 52.8 percent (28of-53) overall and 71 percent (22-of-31) from inside the 3-point arc.

Oakland had beaten Tennessee each of the last two years, but the Golden Grizzlies never had a chance Monday. Tennessee (4-1) took an early 15-2 lead and never looked back.

Travis Bader scored 18 points and Corey Petros added 10 points for Oakland.

MOREHEAD STATE 73, NORFOLK STATE 67: MORE-HEAD, Ky. (AP) - Jarrett Stokes' 3-pointer with 27 seconds remaining put Morehead State ahead to stay with the last of 16 lead changes in a 73-67 nonconference victory over Norfolk State on Monday night.

Milton Chavis had 19 points and 10 rebounds for the Eagles (4-2) and Devon Atkinson had seven assists, including on Stokes' go-ahead bucket.

Brandon Goode got an offensive rebound of Malcolm Hawkins' missed 3-pointer on the next possession for the Spartans (2-5), but Kahlil Owens stole it from him and Morehead State was able to put the game away at the free throw line. Hawkins scored 18 points to lead Norfolk State, which has

played all its games on the road. Kris Brown added 13 points and Jamal Fuentes had 11 assists.

Dylan Howard coached Morehead State. Sean Woods sat out a one-game suspension by the school for berating and shoving Atkinson during a loss to Kentucky last Wednesday.
