Highway 50 Work Expected To Continue Into December

With work still under way on Highway 50 between Gayville and Vermillion, it will be December before the divided thoroughfare returns to four lanes.

Knife River Corporation of Sioux City, Iowa, is the contractor hired by the South Dakota Department of Transportation (SDDÔT) to do the project.

We're in the finishing stages for what work we can accomplish this year," said Ron Peterson, the

Yankton-area engineer for the SDDOT. "The concrete paving work is all done and the asphalt surfacing is all done. Right now, the contractor is working on the grading in the median in the north ditch to get all the drainage profiled. They are getting ready to put in the new signs, delineators and get the seeding and erosion control done.

That process is going a little slow right now — slower than we had hoped, too," he added. "But it's ongoing.

The goal now is to have all four lanes open by Dec. 10, Peterson

Knife River had some other big projects in the region this year, including interstate work near Mitchell and Watertown, which delayed its work on Highway 50. According to its contract with

the state, the company was supposed to be finished with Highway 50 by Nov. 21. It is being charged liquidated damages for the time beyond that date.

'We're at the point where, if we get snow and bad weather, we could open at any time," Peterson said. "The remaining stuff would

have to be finished in the spring. We're kind of hoping to get that dirt work done this fall while conditions are dry, rather than forcing it to happen next spring when things may be wet. As long as the weather stays decent and we don't have to fight snow, we're letting the traffic stay head-to-head and working with the contractor. If we see snow in the forecast in the next couple of days, we'll just tell (the contractor) he's done for the year."




