Quick Hitters

■ SDSU beat Northern Iowa 37-34 in double overtime last Saturday in Brookings, just the second Jackrabbit win over UNI in the Division I era. It marked the third straight week that UNI had lost in overtime.

■ Junior running back Zach Zenner finished with 106 yards on 31 carries, the eighth time this season and 17th in his career that he finished with 100 or more yards rushing. He also passed Anthony Watson (3,712 yards from 2003-06) for third on the SDSU career rushing list, now with 3,749 yards.

■ Cole Langer, a freshman from Dell Rapids, made his first career start in the contest, forcing a fumble on a sack.

■ Brandon Hubert's 14-yard

game-winning touchdown moved him into a tie with Darren Baartman (1988-91) with 128 career receptions. He started the day in a tie with Solomon Johnson (119 receptions from 2001-04) for 10th, and passed Dennis Thomas (127 receptions from 1982-85) on the day. Hubert's efforts earned him Missouri Valley Football Conference Offensive Player of the Week honors.

■ Indiana State may come to Coughlin-Alumni Stadium looking for its first MVFC road victory of the season. If the Sycamores can win at Missouri State this week or SDSU next week, it will mark the first time ISU has had four straight seasons of at least one conference road win.

■ SDSU linebacker R.C. Kilgore had a team-high 15 tackles against UNI. It marked the third straight game and sixth game in seven outings that Kilgore had double figures in tackles. He currently leads FCS football with 99 total tackles, and ranks ninth with an average of 11 tackles per contest.
