



MMC Nursing Program Symposium Set

The Mount Marty College nursing program will welcome Kim Litwach, PhD, RN, FAAN, APNP as the keynote speaker at the 2013 Endowed Chair Nursing Symposium held in Watertown. Her topic will be, "Practical Points in Pain and Palliative Care.

A morning and afternoon session will be held on Thursday, Nov. 7, at Avera Sacred Heart Hospital's Professional Office Pavilion in Yankton and an additional morning session will be held on Friday, Nov. 8, at the Prairie Lakes Hospital conference Center, Medical Office Building in Watertown.

The purpose of the program is to provide nurses, nursing students and nursing faculty practical tips and tools to utilize in pain management and palliative care. Participants will be able to describe patient rights and responsibilities related to pain assessment and management, discuss assessment of pain across the lifespan and in cognitively impaired and/or non-verbal patients, compare myths of pain management with facts, identify pharmacologic and nonpharmacologic management strategies for pain, and to discuss ethical principals' of palliative care.

Litwack is a Family Nurse Practitioner with an expertise in Pain Management. She practices at Advanced Pain Management in Madison, Wis., and has a solid perianesthesia background for the management of acute pain. She is a member of the American Society of Pain Educators. In addition, she is the Associate Dean for Academic Affairs at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee.


