MMC Nursing Program Symposium Set

The Mount Marty College nursing program will welcome Kim Litwach, PhD, RN, FAAN, APNP as the keynote speaker at the 2013 Endowed Chair Nursing Symposium held in Watertown. Her topic will be, "Practical Points in Pain and Palliative Care."
 A morning and afternoon session will be held on Thursday, Nov. 7, at Avera Sacred Heart Hospital's Professional Office Pavilion in Yankton and an additional morning session will be held on Friday, Nov. 8, at the Prairie Lakes Hospital conference Center, Medical Office Building in Watertown.
