Coyotes Swept By Cyclones
AMES, Iowa — Ciara Capezio tallied 19 kills and Mackenzie Bigbee added 13 kills to lead No. 25 Iowa State to a 25-14, 25-22, 25-22 sweep of South Dakota volleyball in a non-conference match on Tuesday night.
The Cyclones (15-6, 8-2 in Big 12) outkilled the Coyotes (18-9, 9-2 in Summit League) 54-29 in the match. Iowa State had eight or more kills than USD in every set, holding a 16-7 advantage in the first, a 20-12 advantage in the second and an 18-10 advantage in the third.
Three Cyclones recorded double-digit digs with Janelle Hudson recording 17, Kristen Hahn tallying 15 and Caitlin Nolan adding 10.
South Dakota was led by Kendall Kriterion's nine kills, Tori Kroll's 19 assists and Audrey Reeg's 12 digs. Kriterion is now three kills short of tying Kristin Miller (2002-05) for fifth on USD's all-time career kills list at 1,324. Kelsey Biltoff had six block assists to help USD to a 10-4 block advantage in the match.
USD will get back into Summit League play on Saturday when they travel to Denver for a 7 p.m. match.

The Rushmores banged out 17 hits and left 18 baserunners in defeat. Craig Severson (Flandreau) pitched six innings of stellar baseball. graduating two of their six state meet runners, and gaining a senior rookie, 2013 state track placewinner Alex Janssen.
"After state track (last spring), I took a step back and looked at what I was doing in high school," he said. "I made the decision that I wanted to run in college. To make the transition easier, I thought I should run cross country this fall."
Even though Janssen had an impressive track resume, he approached cross country like he was just one piece of the puzzle.
"There hasn't been a big ego from any of our runners,"

Jayne Arens said. "There could have been with AJ, but he was such a team player. He fit in like he'd been with the boys since he was a freshman."
The boys' six-man roster changed throughout the season, but the support for those runners did not, Jayne Arens said.
"The six on our guys' team changed five or six times this season. It changed right up to state," she said. "Each time, they all rallied around whoever was in that spot. They were always very supportive."
While the girls' roster did not change as much, those runners kept the first six pushing further, said senior Jazmin Wubben.
"It's not all about the varsity. The JV pushes us," she said. "The JV completely pushes the team. They're our foundation."
The support also crosses gender lines.
"When the boys won, we were so excited for them," McFarland said. "We weren't expecting it at all. It was a lot of fun."
For the seniors — Janssen

and Drew Eskins on the boys' side, and Wubben on the girls' side — the focus now turns to their individual futures, futures they hope includes continuing to run competitively.
"No matter where I go, I'm going to run," said Wubben, who mentioned that Mount Marty College had shown interest in recruiting her.
"Whether I run collegiately or not, we'll see how things play out."
Janssen hopes that his sixth place finish at state helps add to the attention he was already getting.
"I got my name out there a lot during track," he said. "I think this gave them a better idea of what kind of runner I am."
The younger runners aren't ready to let another team take their title just yet.
"We're definitely excited for next year," said junior Kendy Kube. "We know we've got some good freshmen coming up."

Jacks Recover From Bye Week
Following a week off last Saturday, the South Dakota State football team is preparing for an Indiana State squad that is dealing with more than just time off. The Sycamores, instead, have had to deal with the departure of standout running back Shakir Bell.
"If we lost (Zach) Zenner, we would struggle in some phases," SDSU head coach John Stiegelmeier said Tuesday.
With the Jackrabbits coming into Saturday's 2 p.m. home game with Indiana State off an overtime win over Northern Iowa two weeks ago, the Sycamores (1-8, 0-5) are struggling to get much of anything going.
Indiana State boasts only a win over lower-level Quincy, and discounting those 70 points, the Sycamores are averaging only 19 points a game against Division I teams.
"Their defense is very young, at least on paper, so there's always going to be growing pains, I don't care what level you play," Stiegelmeier said. "I respect the quarterback, Mike Perish, I think he's a good player, and he has some good players around him."
The Jacks (5-4, 2-3), meanwhile, really needed a week off.
"This came at a perfect time, we're beat up, mentally beat up, just the stress of a season," Stiegelmeier said. "You appreciate the hard work these guys do, and the wear and tear on their bodies. And then you get a bye week and they get a bounce back in their step."
"We're not even close to where we want to be, health-wise."
The Jacks practiced three days last week, took advantage of some days off and started watching film on the Sycamores, Stiegelmeier said.
