CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were mostly lower Tuesday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for December delivery fell 1 cent to \$6.4525 a bushel; December corn fell 2.50 cents to 4.3225 a bushel; December oats were 3.75 cents lower at \$3.3650 a bushel; while November soybeans advanced 13.50 cents to \$13.1450 a bushel.

Beef mixed and pork lower on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

December live cattle fell .08 cent to \$1.3267 a pound; November feeder cattle was .03 cent higher at \$1.6420 a pound; while December lean hogs fell .85 cent to \$.8720 a pound.

The workshop entitled, "Writers' Workshop: the Poet Within, the Poetry of Memory and Place," will be led by guest artist, Maria Mazziotti Gillan, from Hawthorne, N.J.

The workshop is limited to 25 participants and will use the varied experiences of our daily lives to unearth stories and discover how the places in which we find ourselves affect the way we experience the world. Participants are asked to bring a paper, a pen, and the willingness to take risks. The workshop is free for Center for Active Learners members.

Maria Mazziotti Gillan is the Director of the Creative Writing Program at Binghamton University/State University of New York, and founder and Executive Director of the Poetry Center at Passaic County Community College. Since 2012 she has been on the Honour Committee of IMAGINE & POESIA, the artistic literary movement founded in Turin, Italy, with the patronage of Aeronwy Thomas, daughter of Dylan Thomas. Gillan's work has appeared in: *Prairie Schooner*, *The New York Times*, *Haight Ashbury Literary Journal*, *Voices in Italian Americana*, *Kaleidoscope: Exploring the Experience of Disability Through Literature*, *The Edison Review*, *Red Brick Review*, *The Southeast Review*, *Vivace*, *Differentia* and *The Black Swan Review*. Her poetry includes titles, "After School on Ordinary Days," "Love Poem to My Husband of Thirty-One Years," "Public School #18," "The Ghosts in Our Bed," "How Do I Pack Up the House of My Life?," and "Father Always Bought Used Cars."
