State Rail Plan Meeting Slated For Yankton

ing operation. He was also involved in some financial matters involving the Aberdeen beef plant, according to records at the Brown County Clerk of Courts office.

Sveen also represents dozens of Hutterite colonies in the region on the opposite side of the dispute from attorney Roberts.

The Dakota Provisions turkey processing plant at Huron is owned by 44 growerowners, most of them Hutterite colony farms, according to the company's web site.

Breukelman said the FBI also was interested in the change of ownership of the Aberdeen beef plant from one of its founders. Dennis Hellwig of Aberdeen, to Oshik Song, an EB-5 investor from South Korea who relocated to the Minneapolis area.

Roberts said in an interview Wednesday that he contacted the office of U.S. Sen. Charles Grassley, R-Iowa, in late 2012 with the same information he had given to the

Roberts said he did so because it appeared to him that the FBI investigation had paused or stopped in its investigation and wasn't looking at the Huron plant.

Shortly after receiving Roberts' information, Grassley's office sent a letter to the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services on Feb. 7, 2013. regarding "an EB-5 Regional Investment Center in South Dakota." The only Regional Investment Center was the South Dakota Regional Center based in Aberdeen.

Grassley included a letter from another person with his letter. That second letter hasn't been publicly released by Grassley's office. The public copy of the Grassley letter has that person's name blacked out three times.

Grassley's letter told USCIS: "(Blacked out) has outlined possible violations asso-ciated with the EB-5 program. I would appreciate any assistance you could provide pertaining to this matter. Please contact (blacked out) with questions regarding this let-

Roberts said he has spoken to several people involved with the Northern Beef Packers project in Aberdeen who, he said, told him they were interviewed by the FBI in 2012 and in 2013.

Former plant owner Hellwig is one of those people. Hellwig re-confirmed Thursday that the FBI contacted him. "Once." he said. "It was a matter of a few minutes" a few months ago.

Hellwig declined to provide any further information at this time because the investigation remains underway and the Aberdeen plant is up for sale at auction Dec. 5 in Sioux Falls. The plant went broke and closed last summer, failing to pay its workers.

Northern Beef Packers was one of the projects in South Dakota that used EB-5 financing. Northern Beef received two rounds of loans, the first from South Korean investors and the second from Chinese investors.

Roberts said he had gathered material about several EB-5 projects in South Dakota and related matters at the request of people involved in the continuing leadership struggle at a Hutterian Brethren colony in Spink County.

"I was retained to put together information that would help them resolve the dispute at Hutterville," Roberts said. "Because of what I found, I turned it over to the FBI in November 2011." Roberts said the clients au-

thorized him to approach the FBI. He said he met with two

FBI agents for "a couple hours" in November 2011 at the offices of a Minneapolis law firm that has been directly representing one group in the Hutterville matter.

"I would not have talked to anybody, except what I was authorized to do," Roberts said. Roberts said he confirmed

in approximately March 2012 that a former official with Northern Beef had been approached by the FBI and made a formal statement. That person's statement,

as prepared by the FBI, dealt only with matters regarding Northern Beef and didn't address any other EB-5 investment in South Dakota, according to Roberts. When Roberts didn't hear

of any further interviews by the FBI, he said he looked for another avenue to draw federal attention to the situation. "I then requested Sen.

Grassley's assistance," Roberts said. Grasslev has been active

on immigration issues including the EB-5 program, according to material on his website.

Roberts said Grassley's letter to the U.S. Citizenship and Immigrations Services evidently triggered a renewed FBI investigation.

Roberts said that following his initial meeting with FBI agents he wasn't interviewed in either segment of the subsequent investigation. Roberts said he gathered

information but wasn't a witness to the events and circumstances he described to the FBI and to Grassley's staff. The involvement of

Roberts means the investigation's roots may reach back to the Hutterville dispute and to the original schism in the Hutterite Church. The two sides in the Hut-


terville fight each claims its leader is the true religious leader for the colony. Lawver Sveen represents

the Johnny Wipf faction at Hutterville, while Roberts has been associated with the George Waldner side. The dispute is part of a

broad schism in the Hutterite Church in the U.S. and Canada.
