Comic Books and Commentaries

"Bless the Lord, O my soul, and forget not all his benefits, who forgives all your iniquity, who heals all your diseases, who redeems your life from the pit, who crowns you with steadfast love and mercy, who satisfies you with good so that your youth is renewed like the eagle's." — Psalm 103:2-5

Infrequently, there is a word in the original Hebrew language that doesn't always translate the full impact of the original over to the English. This is a rare occasion and often people fascinated with searching for a "deeper" meaning to the English translation of Greek and Hebrew words found in the Bible are more worrisome than useful since the simple English word is most sufficient almost all of the time. Our translators were language experts and knew what they were doing. In the verse above, there is an exception to this rule. The two words "steadfast love" found in Psalm 103 and many other places in the Old Testament is actually one word in the Hebrew pronounced "hesed" or "chesed" (depending on just which lofty intellectual you happen to be being bored with



at the moment). Hesed is such a complicated and beautiful concept that the English needs two words to try and convey the meaning. One word needs double the explanation- you know it has to be packed full of goodness. And yet at the same time, the force and

emotional punch of this word cannot be conveyed fully. So what is this word that we just read over in the Psalms without a sufficient understanding of its significance? This "steadfast love" could be better explained as "an intensity of loyalty to an unimaginable divine level that is motivated by a relentless persistence and unconditional affection." I actually like the term once used by a Hebrew scholar- "loyal love"- but even these two words don't capture the unction and tenacity of this love that is conveyed in this simple Hebrew word. Loyalty that would die for us. Love that would transform us. This is the very essence of our Heavenly Father. What glory!

Å rabbi once said: "The Scriptures

to halt when we come to this word in the Scriptures and truly meditate and then worship the truth that this simple Hebrew word unpacks to define the deepest character of our Lord and Savior. As a matter of fact, merely looking at the Psalm 103 passage above gives us a more rounded understanding of the glory of this "loyal love." This loyal love pours out into our lives as forgiveness that is completely undeserving. It is a loyal love that reaches into the pit where we live and lifts us out. It is a loyal love that brings satisfaction to our restless soul and rejuvenation to our stiff and ceaseless efforts. Christ crowns his people with the glory of His loyal love... His hesed. Creation was motivated by God's hesed, Christ's crucifixion journey was paved with hesed and the end of history will be shine forth with Christ the King's hesed. But the beauty of our faith for the here and now is that we were initiated, we will continue and we will be ultimately fulfilled by, thorough and for Christ's loyal love... His hesed. This is a truth that should allow us joy in tribulation and desire things above.
