This 'Bully' Will Brighten Your Day

"The Call of the Bully," by Scott Starkey, Simon & Schuster, 2013. 272 pages. (for ages 8-12)



Rodney Rathbone feels your pain.
After being the new kid at school this past year, he somehow survived being targeted by the class bully, Josh, and his crazy-mean teacher, Mrs. Lutzkraut. The summer was looking good with Jessica as his girlfriend. Then Mrs. Lutzkraut convinces his parents that eight weeks away at Camp Wy-Mee would be good for him. Goodbye, Jessica!

To make things even worse, Mrs. Lutzkraut convinces Josh's parents of the same thing. So as this book begins, Rodney is trapped on a bus with Josh, who is ready to pound him into the ground. There's no way he'll be as lucky this summer as he was last school year. Some dumb luck, combined with quick-thinking by Rodney, saved him from Josh's wrath as well as making him a hero.

Without giving too much away, Rodney survives the bus ride. His first few moments at camp, though, earn him a tough enemy, one much smarter than Josh and much richer. Todd is like king at



camp and seems ready to forgive Rodney. It seems like Rodney's lucky day. That is, until someone sets off fireworks in another cabin. And somehow Todd remembers seeing non-existent fireworks in Rodney's bag. It seems Todd has it in for Rodney after all.


