## House Damaged In Afternoon Fire

A house near Lewis & Clark Lake was damaged in a fire Friday afternoon.

According to Deputy Fire Chief Larry Nickles, contractors near Parkview Place saw a vent pipe fall off the roof of a house and noticed smoke coming from the structure around 2 p.m. Friday.

A Lake Station truck was on the scene within seven minutes, which Nickles credits with helping save the structure.

"The lake area firefighter response with a pumper truck in under 10 minutes was a huge factor in saving the struc-

ture as they were set up and ready to extinguish by the time the rest of the equipment arrived," Nickles told the Press & Dakotan.

He estimates damage at around \$50,000. The fire was relegated to the west attic and was under control within about 15 minutes. Nobody was home at the time and the renters are being relocated to a different house for the time being.

The Yankton Fire Department was on the scene for around two hours.

## WALL ST. RECAP

Stocks rose across the globe Friday, capping off a seesaw month for investors, after the Bank of Japan unexpectedly announced new stimulus to boost the country's struggling economy.

## ON FRIDAY:

The Dow rose 195.10 points, or 1.1 percent, to 17,390.52. The S&P 500 rose 23.40 points, or 1.2 percent, to 2,018.05. The Nasdaq composite rose 64.60 points, or 1.4 percent, to 4,630.74.

## FOR THE WEEK:

The Dow rose 585.11 points, or 3.5 percent. The S&P 500 index rose 53.47 points, or 2.7 percent. The Nasdaq rose 147.03 points, or 3.3 percent.

## FOR THE YEAR:

The Dow is up 813.86 points, or 4.9 percent. The S&P 500 index is up 169.69 points, or 9.2 percent. The Nasdaq is up 454.15 points, or 10.9 percent.

## BOARD OF TRADE

CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were mixed Friday on the Chicago Board of Trade. Wheat for Dec delivery fell 3.50 cents to \$5.3250 a bushel; Dec corn was 2.75 cents higher at 3.7675 a bushel; Dec oats fell 2.25 cents to \$3.3625 a bushel; while Nov soybeans advanced 22.25 cents to \$10.4650 a bushel. Beef was mixed and pork was

higher on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. Dec live cattle fell 1.27 cents to \$1.6605 a pound; Jan feeder cattle was unchanged at \$2.2847 a pound; while Dec lean hogs gained .82 cent to \$8.802 a pound.

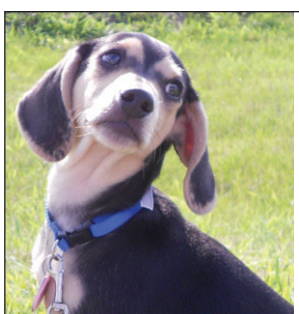
