## Noem Makes Final Re-Election Pitch

Rep. Kristi Noem said this campaign is definitely a change from her first election in 2010.

"It does feel a little bit different than that first race in 2010," said the Republican, who is running for re-election against Democratic challenger Corinna Robinson. "That was a very close race — I had never run for Congress or a race at that level before — so this does have a little bit of a different atmosphere, although we're working up until the last minute hoping that people know what we've been able to accomplish in Washington, D.C. Yet we get a chance to talk about some of the things we'd like to get done."

Noem, who was in Yankton Monday ahead of today's election visiting potential voters, said that there's a lot of value in having so many resources as an incumbent.

"I've learned the value of having the resources you need to tell the message you want your campaign to have," she said. "We've spent several years work-

ing very hard for South Dakota out in Washington, and we have to make sure that the people back in South Dakota know what we did get accomplished — what a good Farm Bill we have; reforms that were necessary for our state; the fact that we've been able to reduce

spending, while making sure projects like Lewis & Clark are funded and get more resources."

## Fordyce Voters To Decide Sales Tax

FORDYCE, Neb. — Voters in the town of Fordyce will decide today (Tuesday) whether to implement a city sales tax.

The measure would create a 1 percent city sales tax and requires a simple majority for passage.

The measure will appear on the ballot for Fordyce residents,

according to Cedar County Clerk Dave Dowling. The outcome of the Fordyce vote will be posted along with the rest of the results on the Cedar County website.

In a 2011 special election, the sales-tax proposal was defeated 40-35. Dowling conducted the all-mail balloting in th
