Decision 2014 **Noem Makes Final Re-Election Pitch**


Rep. Kristi Noem said this campaign is definitely a change from her first election in 2010.

"It does feel a little bit different than that first race in 2010," said the Republican, who is running for re-election against Democratic challenger Corinna Robinson. "That was a very close race

— I had never run for Congress or a race at that level before — so this does have a little bit of a different atmosphere, although we're working up until the last minute hoping that people know what we've been able to accomplish in Washington, D.C. Yet we get a chance to talk about some of the things we'd like to get done.'

Noem, who was in Yankton Monday ahead of today's election visiting potential voters, said that there's a lot of value in having so many resources as an incumbent.

"I've learned the value of having the resources you need to tell the message you want your campaign to have," she said. "We've spent several years work-
