#### **USF Women's Soccer Coach Relieved Of Duties**

SIOUX FALLS — Mekonnen Afa has been relieved of his duties as head women's soccer coach at the University of Sioux Falls, according to an announcement on Tuesday by USF Director of Athletics Josh Snyder.

Afa, who has been head women's coach at USF for 10 seasons, compiled a 102-119-21 overall record, including 2-15-1 this season. In 2014 USF finished tied for 14th in the league standings with MSU-Moorhead, and Wavne State at 2-13.

"We appreciate the many years of service that Mekonnen and his staff provided to USF. We are respectful of his efforts and his guidance of our student-athletes." said Snyder. "However, it is time to move in another direction."

The University will begin an immediate search for a women's head soccer coach. During the in-

terim, Assistant Athletic Director/Senior Women's Administrator Pam Gohl will oversee the program.


