



along pretty well with everybody. We've built a lot of bridges over the years (with) the city. If you don't work together as a community with other entities, you're not going to be going anywhere."

Jensen said he doesn't regret how Dakota Plains and Napa Junction were handled. He said both sides contributed to the deterioration of relations.

"I have no regrets because I still want to see what the TIF's going to do," he said. "Even if it comes back, I want to see how they're going to do that because it never really got addressed. I was for Napa Junction all the way, but dragging their feet — both sides were at fault for that.

He added that if the new commission is going to deal with Dakota Plains, information on the TIF will be crucial.

"We gave them the conditional use (permit) and the re-zone — that was not the problem — but we never came to any conclusion on the TIF," he said. "I'm going to be interested in how the new commission is going to do that."

As for what the new commission will face, Jensen said their biggest challenge in the near future will be roads and infrastructure, especially the Old Highway 50 bridge near Fleeg's.

"The first big issue that they're going to have to deal with is the bridge," he said. "That's \$4 million. Roads have always been a problem for us and they're going to be a problem for them. Roads don't go away and infrastructure won't go away. If you don't have good infrastructure and roads, you're going to be in trouble, and that'll also hinder growth out in the county.'

While Jensen has no ill will over losing, he does have concerns with the tone this elec-

I was very disappointed with the flavor the election was." he said. "I've made it very clear that isn't because I lost — I think a lot of this community — but the mudslinging and the ads that were written ... that was terrible on both sides. The time will also be used to decide what types of groups — public, private, non-profit, etc.- will be eligible for funds.

Nelson emphasized the money will not just be going to the Mead building, but other projects — proposed by both commission members and from public input

— as well. She added the commission already has a couple items they'd like to look at.

'What I know is going to be coming in front of the commission is going to be historic signs and markers designating historic landmarks and locations," she

said. "They've done it in the past and some of those signs have fallen, been taken or are in need of repair."

Nelson said the commission also intends to use the money on documenting the county's history for the public.

"Another (idea) would be in the form of the publication of materials, such as a tour book of the county," she said. "Other projects will be bringing in preservation seminars.

The commission will also be asking for feedback from the county's citizens as time goes along.

"We hope the county residents, even those that weren't so certain at the polls on Tuesday, will gain confidence in this particular commission and be happy with what we decide to do,"

Remember: All Election Signs Must Be Removed By Tuesday, Nov. 11

Yankton ordinance states that election signs and other temporary signs may be posted on private property up to 75 days before an event and must be removed within seven days after.

A good general rule is to keep election signs to the inside (house side) of the public sidewalk or about 15 feet from the roadside curb if there is no sidewalk.

For the safety of all drivers and pedestrians signs cannot be posted in boulevards, attached to utility poles, street signs, street trees, light poles, or be placed in parks.

Signs posted in the public right of way will be removed.
