MITCHELL — The Mount Marty College women finished seventh and the MMC men finished 10th in the Great Plains Athletic Conference Cross Country Championships, held Saturday at Wild Oak Golf Course in Mitchell.

The Dorst women, ranked second nationally, won the women's title. Nebraska Wesleyan's Gabi Jenkins won the 5,00-meter event in 17:42.16. Morningside, ranked 12th in the NAAI, beat out Northwestern and Dorst for the men's title. Morningside's Jay Welp won the 8,000-meter race in 25:10.56.

Junior Jordyn Hudelson (Elk Point) paced the MMC

women, finishing 16th in 18:52.21.
