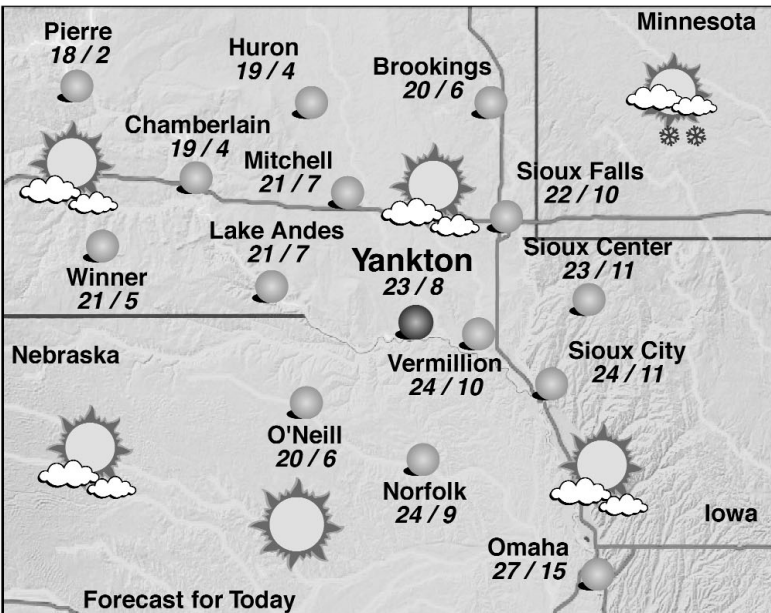

WALL ST. RECAP

The stock market eked out another all-time high on Tuesday, but the gains were slight as investors waited for more news on the economy. As the reporting period for the third quarter winds down, companies have again managed to post strong earnings, allaying investors' concern that slowing growth elsewhere in the world would crimp profits.

ON TUESDAY:

The Dow Jones industrial average gained 1.16 points, or 0.01 percent, to 17,614.90.
The Standard & Poor's 500 index rose 1.42 points, or 0.1 percent, to close at 2,039.68.

The Nasdaq composite climbed 8.94 points, or 0.2 percent, to 4,660.56.

The Dow is up 40.97 points, or 0.2 percent.

CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were higher Tuesday on the Chicago Board of Trade.
Wheat for Dec delivery rose 8 cents to \$5.2525 a bushel; Dec corn was 4.50 cents higher at 3.7375 a bushel; Dec oats were unchanged at \$3.36 a bushel; while Jan soybeans surged 38.25 cents to \$10.64 a bushel.
Beef and pork were mostly higher on the Chicago Mercantile

Exchange.
Dec live cattle rose .13 cent to \$1.6725 a pound; Jan feeder cattle lost .10 cent to \$2.3265 a pound; while Dec lean hogs were .35 cent higher at \$8.990 a pound.

Bitter Cold Can Be Dangerous;
Red Cross Offers Safety Tips

SIOUX FALLS — Frigid air is predicted for many parts of South Dakota and the American Red Cross has steps people can take to stay safe during this hazardous weather.

"We are moving into the time of the year with snow falling and temperatures dropping rapidly," said Executive Director, Tony Burke. "We encourage everyone to be safe while prepping for the seasonal change."

COLD WEATHER SAFETY TIPS

Here are 10 ways to stay safe during this latest round of cold temperatures:

1. Wear layers of light-weight clothing to stay warm. Gloves and a hat will help prevent losing body heat.
2. Know the signs of hypothermia — confusion, dizziness, exhaustion and severe shivering. If someone has these symptoms, they should get immediate medical attention.
3. Watch for symptoms of frostbite including numbness, flushed gray, white, blue or yellow skin discoloration,

numbness or waxy feeling skin.

4. Bring the pets indoors. If that's not possible, make sure they have enough shelter to keep them warm and that they can get to unfrozen water.

5. Avoid frozen pipes — run water, even at a trickle, to help prevent them from freezing. Keep the thermostat at the same temperature day and night to help avoid freezing pipes.

6. Do not use a stove or oven to heat the home.

7. Space heaters should sit on a level, hard surface and anything flammable should be kept at least three feet away.

8. If using a fireplace, use a glass or metal fire screen large enough to catch sparks and rolling logs.

9. Turn off space heaters and make sure fireplace embers are out before leaving the room or going to bed.
