The workshop is open to school food professionals, related staff, and administration in the greater Verdigre area. They'll receive information and participate in hands-on activities on local food procurement, the bidding process, and contracting. A local producer will be on hand to answer specific questions.

"A third of U.S children under the age of 17 are overweight, and only 2 percent of children in the country eat sufficient fruits and vegetables," commented Sandra Renner with the Center for Rural Affairs. "Schools with farm to school

programs are seeing many gains through improved academic achievement, fewer behavioral issues, and improved diets.

Furthermore, according to the 2010 Census Bureau, if each of the 796,793 households in Nebraska committed to spending just \$10 per week on locallygrown foods the state would keep more than \$414 million of the food dollars circulating here in Nebraska, helping both family farms and the local economy. And Nebraskans would have the added benefit of eating fresher, tastier, healthier food.

23rd Estee Lecture Set For USD

VERMILLION — Joseph R. Lakowicz. Ph.D., a member of the Biology and Molecular Biology Department at the University of Maryland School of Medicine, will present the 23rd Estee Lecture at the University of South Dakota at 7 p.m. on Monday, Nov. 17, at Farber Hall, which is located inside Old Main.

Lakowicz is professor of Biochemistry and Molecular Biology at the University of Maryland School of Medicine. He is also the director of the Center for Fluorescence Spectroscopy (CFS), which he established in 1988. He has been developing concepts in fluorescence for 35 years and has published more than 600 peer-reviewed publications, written three single author books, and co-authored more than 20 books. Lakowicz also has more than 40 U.S. patents and is the recipient of numerous awards in the field of fluorescence.

The Center for Fluorescence Spectroscopy was a National Center for Research Resource for 15 years and is continued to be supported by the National Institutes of Health. The CFS has advanced the technology for fluorescence and its applications to the biosciences. Since 2000, Lakowicz has focused his efforts on the use of near-field fluorescence with plasmonics and photonics structures. This work has resulted in the publication of over 100 peer-reviewed papers on this topic, including experimentation, theory and reviews.




