diagnosed with Ebola on Monday, arrived in Omaha on Saturday to be treated at the Nebraska Medical Center's biocontainment unit that has successfully treated two other Ebola patients this fall.

situation," Smith said Sunday, adding that a team of specialists is treating Salia's most serious issues. "We will do everything humanly possible to help him fight this disease."

mostly in Liberia, Guinea and Sierra Leona. Of the 10 people treated for the virus in the U.S., all but one has recovered.

After Salia arrived in Omaha, his ambulance to the hospital was accompanied by a single Nebraska State Patrol cruiser and a fire department vehicle — a subdued arrival in contrast to the August delivery of Dr. Rick Sacra, whose ambulance was flanked by numerous police cars, motorcycles and fire vehicles.

Salia has been working as a general surgeon at Kissy United Methodist Hospital in the Sierra Leone capital of Freetown. It's not clear whether he was involved in the care of Ebola patients. Kissy is not an Ebola treatment unit, but Salia worked in at least three other facilities, United Methodist News said, citing health ministry sources.

Salia, a Sierra Leone citizen who lives in Maryland, first showed Ebola symptoms on Nov. 6 but tested negative for the virus. He eventually tested positive on Monday.

The U.S. State Department said it helped facilitate the transfer of Salia; the U.S. Embassy in Freetown said he paid for the expensive evacuation. The travel costs and care of other Ebola patients flown to the U.S. have been covered by the groups they worked for in West Africa.

Salia's wife, Isatu Salia, said in a telephone interview that when she spoke to her husband early Friday his voice sounded weak and shaky. But he told her "I love you" in a steady voice, she said.

The two prayed together, and their children, ages 12 and 20, are coping, Isatu Salia said, calling her husband "my everything."

Nebraska Medical Center spokesman Taylor Wilson said members of Salia's family were not at the hospital Saturday, but were expected to arrive "in the near future."

Sierra Leone is one of the three West Africa nations hit hard by an Ebola epidemic this year. Five other doctors in Sierra Leone have contracted Ebola, and all have died.

11-Year-Old Killed In I-29 Crash

BROOKINGS (AP) — Authorities have named a boy who died in a three-vehicle crash on Interstate 29, about 12 miles south of Brookings.

The South Dakota Highway Patrol says 11-year-old Jack Lawrence, of Beresford, was a passenger in a Chevrolet Suburban that was northbound on I-29 about 10:30 a.m. Saturday when the driver lost control while attempting to pass another vehicle. The Suburban crossed through the median and into the southbound lane, where it collided with a trailer attached to a Mack truck.

The Patrol says a third vehicle, a car that was heading south, also struck the Suburban.

Jack was thrown from the Suburban even though he was wearing a seatbelt.

The driver and two other juveniles in the Suburban were injured in the crash.

So. Dak. Digitizes Historic Newspapers

PIERRE (AP) — The South Dakota State Historical Society is digitizing archival newspapers to preserve state history and give researchers online access.

The society is using a nearly \$300,000 two-year federal grant to work with the Minnesota Historical Society to modernize the records, The Daily Republic of Mitchell reported. The society will digitize 100 rolls of microfilm from newspapers that stopped publication in 1922 or earlier.

'We have to select newspapers that have an end date of 1922, so it'll be earlier newspapers that qualify," said Chelle Somsen, a state archivist who's overseeing the project. "A committee is going to meet and decide which title to start with, so no decisions have been made yet."

The National Endowment for the Humanities grant allows South Dakota to participate in a Library of Congress project that aims to develop a searchable online database of selected U.S. newspapers. The Chronicling America Project allows researchers to search the database for free.

'The funds we received will help preserve and promote South Dakota's rich history," Somsen said.

Although the digitization will be done out of state, members of the South Dakota and Minnesota historical societies will check each image to ensure they are easy to read. Others will help create histories for each newspaper that's digitized and study the publications to create searchable databases for each page.

"Otherwise, the vendor would only digitize the pages and we'd end up with images. We'll make sure the images are read-able and searchable," Somsen said.

North Dakota and Iowa began digitizing their newspapers last year.

SIOUX FALLS (AP) - Retiring U.S. Sen. Tim Johnson says he would vote against legislation to approve the Keystone XL oil pipeline should the Senate bring the long-delayed project up for a vote.

Johnson confirmed his opposition Friday. His decision comes as the U.S. House voted to approve the legislation.

The GOP-controlled House has voted several times to approve the pipeline, which would move Canadian oil to the Gulf Coast and would cut through South Dakota. Legislation on



REPUBLICAN CITY, Neb. (AP) - The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers will begin repairing the Harlan County Dam's discharge gates early next year in a \$12.3 million project.

The Kearney Hub reports corrosion has built up on the dam's gates after more than 50 years of use in south-central Nebraska.

Ken Stark with the Corps says the dam's gates are also difficult to operate because of friction problems with the bearings.

The gates are used to release water stored for the downstream Bostwick Irrigation districts in Nebraska and Kansas. They're also used to release floodwaters when the lake is high.

The initial project will take about 3 1/2 years to complete. Stark says funding is available for repairs to the dam's other 12 gates.

Heritage Center Holiday Event Set

PIERRE (AP) — The theme of this year's holiday open house of the South Dakota State Historical Society is "A Prairie Christmas.

The event is slated for Nov. 28 at the Cultural Heritage Center in Pierre. Officials says the center's lobby will be decorated with branches and wreaths for the historical society's largest event of the year.

The event will include free admission to the new exhibit "Play Ball! The National Pastime in South Dakota," and livinghistory demonstrations.

Visitors will also be able to buy Laura Ingalls Wilder's memoir "Pioneer Girl: The Annotated Autobiography." The historical society's press will release the book Monday.

Officials are encouraging visitors to bring canned goods to donate to the local food pantry.

SD Joins Distance Learning Initiative

PIERRE (AP) - South Dakota has joined a national distance learning initiative that will make more courses available to students across state lines.

Jack Warner is the executive director and CEO of the South Dakota Board of Regents. Warner says officials must help students gain access to high quality programs as distance learning at the postsecondary education level continues to grow.

Warner says the state is joining the initiative through a reciprocity agreement. Staff members from the board will begin accepting applications from South Dakota schools next month that wish to participate in the agreement, which would allow them to offer classes to students in other states that have similar agreements.

More than 22,500 students attending one of South Dakota's six public universities enrolled in a distance education course last year.

Caution Urged For Drivers At Wind Cave


WIND CAVE NATIONAL PARK (AP) - Wind Cave National Park officials are urging drivers to use caution when traveling through the park as bison and other large animals are once again on or near the roadways because of the recent snowfalls.

Bison and other large animals such as elk are drawn to the roads by salt used to melt snow and ice during winter storms. The park doesn't salt its roads, but salt is carried into the park by outside vehicles.

Park superintendent Vidal Davila says at least three bison have been injured after being hit by drivers near the park's southern entrance along Highway 385.

Davila adds the bison gather in the driving lanes next to the cattle guards and are particularly difficult to see at night. The park is home to about 400 bison.
