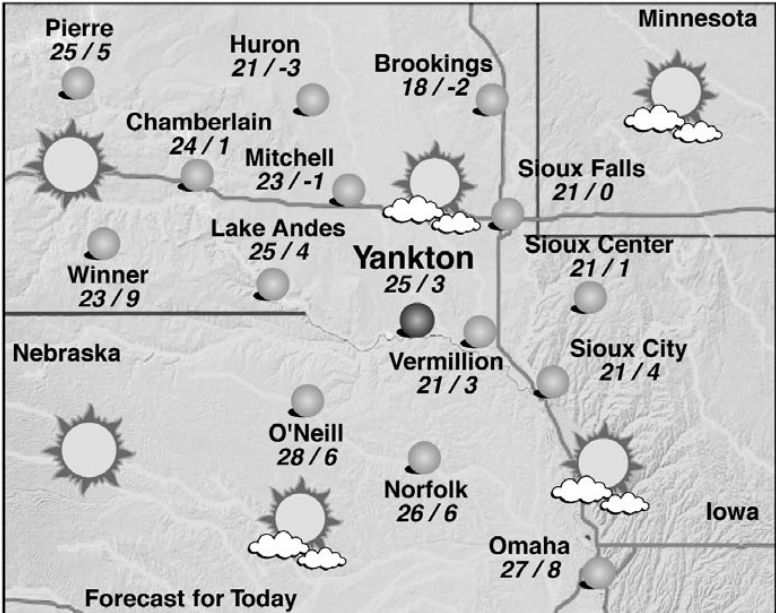

WALL ST. RECAP

U.S. stocks rose Tuesday, delivering the latest record highs for the Dow Jones industrial average and the Standard & Poor's 500 index. Investors were encouraged by a positive outlook from homebuilders and better news from Japan and Germany. Health care stocks had some of the biggest gains, while the energy sector lagged the rest of the market as the price of oil resumed its slide.

ON TUESDAY:

The Dow Jones industrial average gained 40.07 points, or 0.2 percent, to 17,687.82.

The Standard & Poor's 500 index rose 10.48 points, or 0.5 percent, to close at 2,051.80.

The Nasdaq composite climbed 31.44 points, or 0.7 percent, to 4,702.44.

FOR THE WEEK:

The Dow is up 53.08 points, or 0.3 percent.

The S&P 500 index is up 11.98 points, or 0.6 percent.

The Nasdaq is up 13.90 points, or 0.3 percent.

FOR THE YEAR:

The Dow is up 1,111.16 points, or 6.7 percent.

The S&P 500 index is up 203.44 points, or 11 percent.
