**Mountain Lion Killed In Northeast Nebraska**

LINCOLN, Neb. (AP) — A hunter has killed a mountain lion in northeast Nebraska's Dakota County. The Nebraska Game and Parks Commission says in a news release that the 89-pound female was killed on Monday morning. It's the second mountain lion killed in what's called the Prairie Unit since the season opened Jan. 1. The commission has four units designated for hunting mountain lions. They are Pine Ridge in the northern Nebraska Panhandle, Upper Yaw in the southern Panhandle, Keya Paha (kee-PAW puh-HAW) in north-central Nebraska, and Prairie, which covers the rest of the state. The other units are closed for hunting now. The hunting has drawn criticism from hunting opponents and people who don't believe there are enough mountain lions in the state to justify the seasons.

**No. 11 WICHITA STATE 71, MEMPHIS 56:** SIoux FALLS (AP) — Ron Baker scored 21 points to lead No. 11 Wichita State to a 71-56 win Tuesday over Memphis, pushing the Shockers' regular-season win streak to a nation-leading 33 games.  
Fred VanVleet had 15 points and Darius Carter added 12 for the Shockers (2-0).  
The Tigers were led by Nick King's 16 points. Austin Nichols and Avery Woodson added 10 each.  
Wichita State led 39-22 at half, holding the Tigers to a 5-for-21 shooting from the field while forcing 14 turnovers. The Shockers had a 15-2 run early in the second half, capping it with Baker's 3-pointer with 13:43 to play to give Wichita State a 47-31 lead.  
The neutral-site game at the Sanford Pentagon was the first of the season for the Tigers and the second for the Shockers, who defeated New Mexico State 71-54 on Nov. 14.  
**NORTH DAKOTA 76, MAYVILLE STATE 39:**

GRAND FORKS, N.D. (AP) — Jaron Nash had his first career double-double with 16 points and 12 rebounds to lead North Dakota to a dominating 76-39 win over NIAA's Mayville State on Tuesday night.  
Joshiah Coleman, who was 3 of 5 from outside the arc, had 13 points and Quinton Hooker added 11.  
Mayville State led 14-13 midway of the first half, but North Dakota (1-1) went on a 10-0 run and built a 38-24 halftime lead. The Comets were limited to just 15 points in the second half. They committed 27 turnovers in the game.  
UND made 7 of 18 3-pointers, and hit 26 of 55 field goal attempts. The Comets made 14 of 46 shots from the floor.  
Chuck Robinson led Mayville State with 14 points and 10 rebounds. Michael Lindsey contributed 11 points.  
**NORTHERN IOWA 79, STEPHEN F. AUSTIN 77, OT:** NACOGDOCHES, Texas (AP) — Paul Jespersen's putback with 39.7 seconds left in overtime gave Northern Iowa a 79-77 win over Stephen F. Austin on Tuesday that snapped the Lumberjacks' 34-game home winning streak.  
Five players scored in double figures for the Panthers (2-0), led by 15 from Marvin Singleton. Northern Iowa had to rally from 8 points down in the second half to force overtime on Deon Mitchell's 3-point play with 50.8 seconds left to knot the score at 70-70.  
After Jespersen's bucket, Thomas Walkup missed a 3-pointer for the Lumberjacks (1-1) and

Wes Washpun was fouled with 10.7 seconds left. He missed the second free throw and the home team raced down the floor, only for Demetrius Floyd's floater in the lane to hit the back of the rim and bounce out.  
Walkup and Floyd led the Lumberjacks with 20 points each, though Stephen F. Austin hoisted 27 3-point attempts and made only 10. Northern Iowa hit 5 of 12 shots from long range — including 4 of 5 in the second half.

South Dakota State's Skyler Flatten missed a 3 on the other end and, after grabbing the offensive rebound, Cody Larson missed a layup before Scott hit a 3-pointer coming out of a timeout to make it 80-75 with 10 seconds left.  
Deondre Parks got a quick layup 2 seconds later and immediately fouled Scott, who hit a pair of free throws and closed the scoring at 82-77 with 6 seconds left.  
Parks and Jake Bittle scored 18 apiece for South Dakota State (0-2). Larson finished with 14 points and 10 rebounds and Flatten scored 13.  
Idaho made 8 of 15 from behind the arc and grabbed 16 offensive rebounds.

It's that pedigree that attracted the attention of USD women's basketball coach Amy Williams. "Aaron has done an amazing job, and those Arens girls are a huge part of that," Williams said Tuesday before getting on a flight to Oregon. "Allison is just a winner; she knows how to win."  
So too do her teammates. Crofton has won six state girls' basketball titles in 10 years under Losing, who has a 236-21 career record with the Warriors. "It's a special thing they have going down there," Williams said. "We're excited to keep that Crofton pipeline coming. It's done us well so far."  
Losing first sent Amber Hegge to USD, where she finished her 5-year career (2007-12) ranked second all-time in scoring, and then came Bridget Arens who played in all 33 games — including the NCAA Tournament — last season for the Coyotes. "We've had some nice players come through our program," Losing said. "To

play at that level, you've got to be pretty special, and we're lucky enough to have had a couple."  
Allison Arens, who committed to USD during her junior season, probably could have gotten offers from teams in the Big Ten Conference or Big 12 Conference, Losing said — but the majority of her offers were from within the Summit League. "It was one of those deals, when we realized she was going to the Summit League, USD was going to be a perfect choice," Losing said.  
Arens was in the stands for USD's semifinal win last season over South Dakota State in the Summit League tournament, and watched — like many other regional fans — as the Coyotes played in the NCAA Tournament. "It helped me feel more comfortable with my decision," Arens said. "I was happy for all of them, I thought they all deserved it."  
The relationship she's built with Williams also played a key role in her decision, Arens said. "Just from what I can see, she's doing a great job," Arens said. "Every time she calls me, she cares so much about what's going on in my life. I feel like I'll really like playing for her."

As to how soon that happens, both coaches were confident Arens could see the floor early for USD. "From what I know of Amber and Bridget's talent level, and knowing the Summit League, I think Allison's going to make a fairly immediate impact on that program," Losing said. "The coaches will figure out how to enhance her talents and use those talents the best way they can."  
The Coyotes will graduate two starting guards, Nicole Seekamp and Raeshel Contreras, so there could be some options for Arens, Williams said. "She's at that level, she's ready to step in," Williams said. "There's always a little bit of a learning curve when you jump from high school, but she's very competitive and intelligent."  
There's still a year before Arens has to worry about fighting for playing time with the Coyotes, she pointed out. "I'm actually a little nervous about that, but I guess we'll see," Arens said, adding a chuckle.

"They remind me of Tea Area and Beresford," Pruett said, comparing the Pheasants to teams from the Panthers' Dakota XII Conference. "They rely on a middle attack."  
For a second straight year, a potential battle with Sioux Falls Christian (25-6) looms. The top-seeded Chargers and Dakota Valley met in the semifinals a year ago, with the Panthers winning, and in the 2012 championship, with SFC claiming the prize.  
The Chargers won both regular season meetings this year, a five-setter on Sept. 25 in Sioux Falls and a 25-23, 26-24 match in the Dakota XII Conference Tournament on Oct. 18. Those are the only

two losses to South Dakota teams for the Panthers, who also lost to Wayne, Nebraska, and LeMars, Iowa. "It's crazy how the seeding points work. We both feel these are the top two teams in the state," Pruett said. The South Dakota Sportswriters Volleyball poll listed the Chargers and Panthers in the top two spots for all but the preseason poll. "We have to beat them anyways to win it. It is a very familiar situation."  
For the Panthers to make another title run, they will need to "play within themselves," according to Pruett. "In our four losses, we made young mistakes. We have to be confident and play our game," she said. "If we do that, I have a good feeling we could repeat as state champions."  
Sioux Falls Christian opens against Sisseton (19-11) at noon on Thursday. The evening session features

third-seeded Pine Ridge (33-1) against Miller (21-7) at 6 p.m., followed by second-seeded Mount Vernon-Plankinton (27-3) against Lead-Deadwood (23-6) at 7:45 p.m.
