A Look At Thanksgiving

Thanksgiving is celebrated every year in our country on the fourth Thursday in November. While today this holiday is associated with feasting, family and football, the pilgrims who were at the original harvest meal of 1621 found themselves grateful for other reasons. For the pilgrims this day of proclamation started earlier that summer. From the Wampanoag Indian friends, the pilgrims received much needed assistance to raise their crops and survive the harsh elements,

Having landed in New England on Dec. 11, 1620, the Mayflower Compact was written and signed in order for the colony to be able to settle and survive the coming winter. It had been their original intent to reach the Jamestown Colony in Virginia. With the opportunity of freedom of religion and self attainment they left England in 1620 on the Mayflower financed by the Company of Merchant Adventurers of London. As separatists they did not want to be a part of the state church. They must have seen this as their own opportunity to worship freely.

Now being in an unsettled area, some of the passengers were inspired to proclaim that since the settlement would not be made in the agreed upon Virginia territory, they "would use their own liberty for none had power to command them ..." To prevent this, many of the other colonists chose to establish a government. The Mayflower Compact was based simultaneously upon a majoritarian model and the settlers' allegiance to the king. It was in essence a contract in which the settlers consented to follow the compact's rules and regulations for the sake of order and survival. Part of this compact read as follows:

"Having taken for the Glory of God, and the advancement of the Christian Faith and honor of our King and Country, a voyage to plant the first colony in the northern parts of Virginia, do by these presents, solemnly and mutually,

in the presence of God, and one another, covenant and combine one another into a single body politic, for our better ordering, and preservation and furtherance of the ends aforesaid, and by virtue to enact, constitute, and frame, such just and equal laws, ordinances, acts, and constitutions, and offices, from time to time, as so be thought most meet and convenient for the general good of the colony, unto which we promise all due submission and obedience.

In witness here of we have hereunto subscribed names at Cape Cod the 11th of November, in the year of the reign of our sovereign King James, of England, France, Ireland the eighteenth and of Scotland the fifty-fourth, 1620."

In examining and reflecting upon the wording and thinking behind this covenant one cannot ignore in the words chosen respect these people had for law and order and the need for responsible government. Upon landing, the pilgrims conducted a prayer service and quickly turned to building shelters. Malnutrition and illness during the ensuing New England winter killed nearly half their number. Through prayer and hard work, with the assistance of their Indian friends a rich harvest was reaped in the summer of 1621.

Such ready abundance soon waned, however. Demands from investors who funded their endeavor the Pilgrims found themselves obligated under a disastrous arrangement holding all crops and property in common, in order to return an agreed to half of their produce to their overseas backers. Within two years Plymouth was in danger of floundering under famine, blight and drought. Edward Winslow wrote, "The most courageous were now discouraged because God, who hitherto had

been our only shield and supporter, now seemed in His anger to arm himself against us."

Governor Bradford's record of the history of the colony described 1623 as a period of arduous work coupled with "a good drought ... without any rain and great heat for the most part," lasting from spring until midsummer. The Pilgrims soon thereafter thought better of relying solely on the physical realm, setting "a solemn day of humiliation to seek the Lord in humble and fervent prayer, in this great distress."

In affirmation of their faith and providing a great witness to the Indians, by evening of that day the skies became overcast and gentle rains fell, restoring the yield of the fields. Governor Bradford noted, "And afterwards, the Lord sent to them such seasonable showers. With interchange of fair warm weather as, through His blessing caused a fruitful and liberal harvest, to their no small comfort and rejoicing. For which mercy in tome convenient, they also set aside a day of thanksgiving."

Bradford's diary records how the colonists repented of their financial folly under sway of their financiers. "At length, after much debate of things, the Governor (with the advice of the chiefest among them) gave way that they should set com every man for his own particular, and in that regard trust to themselves, in all other ways to go in the general way as before, and so assigned to every family a parcel of land according to their number."

Winslow noted that the Pilgrims' action as believing "it would be great ingratitude if we should secretly smother up the same, or content ourselves with private thanksgiving for that, which by private prayer could not be obtained. And therefore another solemn day was set apart and appointed for that end; where in we returned glory, honor and praise, with all thankfulness, to our good God, which dealt so gracious with us. ..."

This was the original American Thanksgiving Day, centered not on harvest feasting (as in 1621) but on gathering together to publicly recognize the favor and provision of almighty God.
