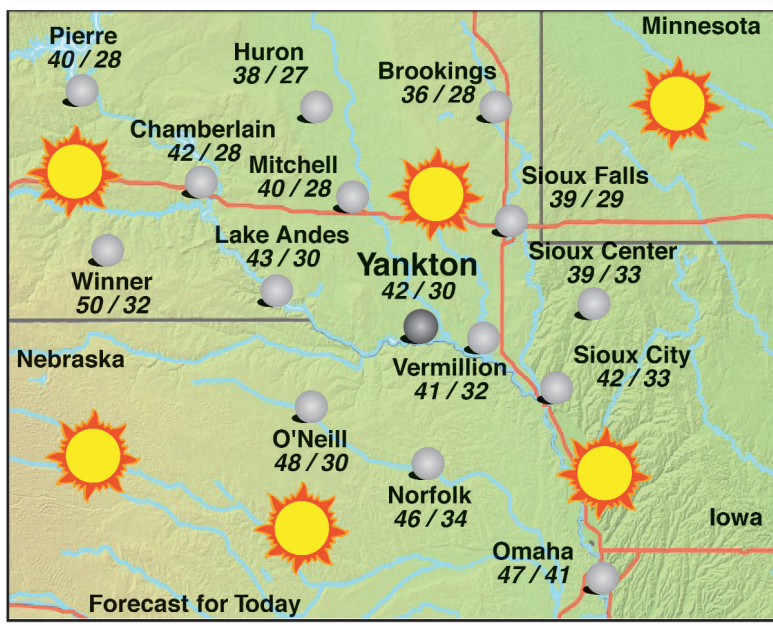

**WALL ST. RECAP**

U.S. stocks closed higher Friday, edging further into record territory as investors welcomed a move by China to stimulate its economy by lowering interest rates.

Hints from the head of Europe's central bank that it might step up its own stimulus efforts also helped lift stocks. The Dow Jones industrial average and the Standard & Poor's 500 index closed at record highs.

The Dow climbed 91.06 points, or 0.5 percent, to 17,810.06.

The S&P 500 index added 10.75 points, or 0.5 percent, to 2,063.50.

The Nasdaq composite rose

11.10 points, or 0.2 percent, to 4,712.97.

Exchange. Feb live cattle gained .33 cent to \$1.7215 a pound; Jan feeder cattle was 1.03 cents higher at \$2.3660 a pound; while Feb lean hogs fell .45 cent to \$9.045 a pound.
