
The teams split the first two sets before the Riders won the final two.

## Defending Champions Prepare For Rematch Of 2013 Final

As it turns out, yes, Sioux Falls O'Gorman was tested at the state tournament. But the top-ranked Knights

still recorded another sweep.

Keyed again by senior hitter Taryn Kloth, O'Gorman defeated a scrappy Huron team 25-18, 25-23, 25-20 in Friday night's semifinals of the S.D. State Class AA Volleyball Tournament at the Summit Center.

"I think that was very good for us to be tested a little bit at a state tournament, especially for (today). said Kloth, who had 21 kills - most coming late in sets, when the Knights really needed a surge.

'It'll be another good test

The defending champion Knights, who are undefeated against South Dakota teams, advance to tonight's (Saturday) 8 p.m. championship match.

Another semifinal victory was nice, sure, but O'Gorman isn't settling, said head coach Julie Kol-

"It's one of those things, when you win it one time, you want it again," Kolbeck said. "You're not going to be satisfied until you get

there again. 'Our kids are happy going to the championship, but again,

you're not quite there yet." An improved Huron team stood in the way.

When the teams met early in the regular season, O'Gorman

swept by scores of 25-12, 25-15, 25-12. But the Tigers knew that had to change.

"Our goal was pretty much to close the gap, and I felt like we did that," said Huron senior setter Lexi Eckmann, who recorded 24 set assists and five kills.

The Knights overcame an early scare in the first set, as Huron jumped out to a 13-9 lead. Order was restored, though, once Kloth got going — she had nine kills in the first set.

Huron was even better in the second set, pushing O'Gorman the entire way before the Knights finally scratched through.

"Looking at the seniors we have on the court, (we had to say), 'look at your past experiences," Kolbeck said. "And it showed.

"They kept their composure,

and did a great job.' The Knights then led from the start in set three to end any hope Huron had of mounting a come-

Samantha Zell led a balanced Tigers attack with eight kills, while Bailey Rathjen added seven kills and Sarah Carr had six kills.

"We knew there were two things we could control, and that was attitude and effort," Huron coach Shelly Buddenhagen said. We just wanted to give them a little bit of a fight, and for the most part, I thought we competed really hard.'

### Warner Downs Parker In 'B' Semifinals

ABERDEEN — Warner is back in familiar territory.

The Monarchs swept Parker in straight sets 25-23, 25-20 and 25-10 Friday to advance to the State B volleyball championship match tonight at Golden Eagles Arena.

The Monarchs will play Chester Area at 8 tonight as they will try to win their third straight state title.

"It feels awesome," senior libero Kaitlyn Boesl said about playing for another state title. "That was our goal all season to make it back to the state championship and we did it. It feels great.

Warner freshman hitter Peyton Ellingson powered the Monarchs with a match-high 15 kills on Friday night. She added four digs, three blocks and one ace.

"Peyton Ellingson played the game of her season." Warner coach Kari Jung said. "Defensively, serving, she hit lights out tonight. It was awesome. I was really proud of how she played.

The Monarchs received another balanced effort on the night. Jaici Schlosser added 14 kills and two blocks. All-stater Ashley Rozell had 3 aces, 10 kills, 13 digs and 24 assists.

"I thought we played well as a unit," Jung said. "Ashley Rozell struggled a little more out of the gates. She was trving to find holes and I think the rest of the players picked it up for her and usually we see it the other way around, but she played very well in the whole game as well. It was nice to see our other hitters step in and hit."

Even though the Monarchs picked up their 31st sweep of the season, they had a tough time shaking off the pesky Pheasants. Warner jumped ahead 5-2 early in the first set, but Parker hung around and took a 20-19 lead. The set was then tied at 20-20, 21-21 and 22-22 before the Monarchs closed on a 3-1 run to eke out the first-set win.

"It just sets the tone for the rest of the match," said Boesl about winning the first
